AGENDA HEADING:

Approve purchase of two ambulances for use in the Des Moines Fire Department (DMFD).

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the low, compliant bid from Emergency Vehicle Sales & Service, Eugene Draper, President, 1781 Balsam Avenue, Alexander, IA 50420, for the purchase of two Type 1 ambulances, including specified loose equipment.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Invitation to Bid V11-046 was sent to 10 potential vendors, with two responses for the provision of two Type 1 ambulances built to specifications developed by the DMFD to replace two units currently in service of which one has reached the end of its practical useful life in urban service, and one to replace a frontline unit recalled from reserve status when Medic 7, at Fire Station #7, was placed into service. Emergency Vehicles Sales and Service submitted the low, compliant bid of \$188,159 per unit, for a total cost of \$376.318, with a trade-in allowance for a 2005 F350 Ford/Lifeline Type 1 ambulance of \$15,000. The total cost after trade-in is \$361,318.

The specifications developed by the DMFD have ensured that the City purchases ambulances that stand up to the severe demands of the operating environment. Other vendors can build ambulances to DMFD specifications, but many choose not to; national vendors manufacture stock models that are not compliant with the patient care module construction requirements, cabinet and workspace plan, electrical load management hardware and software, etc. Previous experience with variances from specification to broaden vendor response has yielded unsatisfactory consequences that have impacted service capacity, caused significant repair costs and resulted in threatened legal proceedings in order to have units remanufactured. A subsequent purchase order for additional units was rescinded. Lifeline Ambulances have proven their durability and have provided good value. The Chief of the Fire Department and the Procurement Administrator recommend awarding the contract for purchase to Emergency Vehicle Sales and Service and requests authorization to proceed with the acquisition of two ambulances.
