AGENDA HEADING:

Approving and authorizing the execution of a Reimbursement Agreement with MCI Communication Services Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$99,164.50 for relocation of a fiber optic line as required by the I-235 Dean's Lake Storm Sewer Outlet Phase 2 project.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the Reimbursement Agreement with MCI Communications Services, Inc., not to exceed \$99,164.50, for relocation of an existing fiber optic cable in conflict with a 90" storm sewer to be constructed as part of the I-235 Dean's Lake Outlet Storm Sewer Phase 2 project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$99,164.50

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

An existing fiber optic cable is in conflict with a 90" storm sewer to be constructed as part of the I-235 Dean's Lake Outlet Storm Sewer Phase 2 project. The fiber optic cable must be relocated to allow for construction of the new sewer. MCI Communications Inc. owns the fiber optic cable which is located within the Union Pacific Railroad right of way. A Reimbursement Agreement has been negotiated with MCI Communications, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$99,164.50, to provide the necessary labor and materials to relocate the fiber optic cable.

The Preconstruction Agreement for Dean's Lake Phase 2 Storm Sewer Outlet project negotiated with Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) and approved by City Council (Roll Call 10-582) identified the responsibilities of IDOT and the City regarding the administration, funding, and implementation of the project construction, as well as future maintenance responsibility of City facilities. Relocation of existing utilities is identified in the Preconstruction Agreement to be performed by the City at no cost to IDOT. Construction of the I-235 Dean's Lake Storm Sewer Outlet Phase 2 project is proceeding and is expected to extend through the 2011 construction season. The general alignment of the storm sewer extends from the south side of I-235 at Ure Street southerly to University Avenue, then westerly to

Union Pacific railroad tracks, and then southerly along the abandoned railroad right-of-way to Deans Lake.
