AGENDA HEADING:

Approve the Form of Agreement between West Bank and the City of Des Moines for the Dispersal of Federal Home Loan Bank Affordable Housing Program Grant Funds

SYNOPSIS:

Approval of the Form of Agreement with West Bank that delineates responsibilities and procedures for satisfying monitoring and compliance requirements for grant funds from the Federal Home Loan Bank. The grants, for a total of \$300,000, go directly into home repairs for low-income owner-occupants that have emergency housing situations.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$300,000

Funding Source: Federal Home Loan Bank of Des Moines

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Federal Home Loan Bank of Des Moines provides grant funds for member banks through its Affordable Housing Program. A member bank may sponsor a non-profit or government organization to make application to administer a program that preserves affordable housing for low-income residents. Applications for funds are held annually and are very competitive.

On June 14, 2010, by Roll Call 10-922, City Council approved a grant application to the Federal Home Loan Bank for \$300,000 for the Minor Home Repair Program using West Bank as a sponsor. Only certain banks in the Des Moines area are Member Institutions of the Federal Home Loan Bank and are able to make application for the funds. West Bank is headquartered at 1601 22nd Street in West Des Moines. Dan McNace is the Executive Vice President of West Bank with signature privileges from the Federal Home Loan Bank of Des Moines.

On November 23, 2010, West Bank and the City of Des Moines were notified that the grant application was successful.

On January 24, 2011, by Roll Call 11-0106, City Council approved Forms of Agreement among West Bank, the Federal Home Loan Bank, and the City of Des Moines for implementation of the Grants. West Bank has requested that the City of Des Moines approve an additional agreement that provides processes

and procedures needed for satisfying monitoring and compliance requirements.

The Neighborhood Conservation Division will assist approximately 100 low-income homeowners at approximately \$3,000 for each household with the Minor Home Repair Program. The program also utilizes Community Development Block Grant funds and funds from the Polk County Housing Trust Fund. Staffing funds are provided through CDBG for the Neighborhood Conservation Division, Community Development Department.
