AGENDA HEADING:

Approving and Authorizing Execution of Agreements for Electrical Service with MidAmerican Energy, in conjunction with the Jackson Avenue Detention Basin Pump Stations Project, not to exceed \$48,490.78.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the Refundable Advance for Construction Underground Electric Service Extension Agreement with MidAmerican Energy, not to exceed \$48,490.78, for a three-phase underground electric line for the Jackson Basin Pump Station included in the Jackson Avenue Detention Basin Pump Station project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$48,490.78

<u>Funding Source</u>: 2010-2011 CIP, Page Storm Water – 7, Crawford Creek – Watershed Improvements, STE074, Being: \$5,000,000 maximum in HUD Disaster funds from the Iowa Department of Economic Development for 100% of construction costs associated with the Jackson Avenue Detention Basin Pump Station in Federal Jumpstart Infrastructure Assistance funds, and remaining funds in Storm Water Revenue Bonds to be issued.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

This project is funded predominantly from a HUD disaster funds Jump Start grant through the Iowa Department of Economic Development. The contract for the construction of the Jackson Avenue Detention Basin Pump Station Project was awarded on September 13, 2010 to Rice Lake Contracting Corp. d/b/a as Rice Lake Construction Group, in the amount of \$5,455,000, which was \$695,000 below the Engineers estimate. This Pump Station project is critical to the conveyance of storm water away from the Crawford Creek neighborhoods. The contract includes an emergency generator to provide backup power in the event of electrical distribution system disruption.

MidAmerican Energy will extend a three-phase electric line underground to the proposed pump station at 1503 SE 9th Street. MidAmerican Energy will furnish the necessary labor and materials required to extend a three-phase electric line underground to said pump station. The amount of \$48,490.78 is an advance for construction subject to refund, which represents the full amount due from the City of Des Moines for the extension of a three-phase electric line underground to the proposed pump station.
