### **AGENDA HEADING:**

Ordering construction of the following: Police Station Window Replacement - Receiving bids, (4-12-11), and Setting date of hearing, (4-25-11). (Construction Estimate - \$613,600).

# **SYNOPSIS:**

Recommend the City Council proceed with construction of the improvement and set dates to receive bids and hold a public hearing, as required by Iowa Code, utilizing the method of financing referenced below. This project includes the installation of aluminum replacement windows at the Police Station, as approved by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHP0), and as approved by the City Council on July 12, 2010 utilizing a Department of Energy (DOE), Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG).

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Amount: \$613,000 City Engineer's Estimate

<u>Funding Source</u>: 2011-2012 CIP, Page Building-7, Energy Conservation, BLD110, being: \$513,600 in Department of Energy, Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant with the local share of the grant being \$100,000 in G. O. Bonds to be issued. (unbudgeted).

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

On February 22, 2010, the City Council accepted a Department of Energy (DOE), Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) along with an Energy Strategy plan in the amount of \$1,982,300. The grant will fund a number of energy projects including new windows for City Hall and the Police Station, energy efficient vehicles, and others. The EECBG is a part of the American Resource and Recovery Act (ARRA). The primary purposes of the program are to reduce fossil fuel emissions, maximize benefits to local and regional communities, reduce total energy use of eligible entities, and improve energy efficiencies in the building and transportation sectors and others. To date the Council has approved the following items funded by this grant:

- Awarded the contract for the City Hall Window Replacement on February 14, 2011, to Strong Tower Construction, LLC, dba Koch Corporation, Benjamin Feinn, CEO, 1131 Logan Street, Louisville, KY 40204, in the amount of \$421,414.
- Authorized purchase of hybrid vehicle replacements on March 14, 2011, utilizing \$51,704.40 of the EECBG to pay down the incremental cost difference between a traditional replacement vehicle and the

hybrid vehicle.

The March 28, 2011, agenda will include two projects with EECBG funding for City Council consideration to authorize bids on April 20, 2011, being:

- Police Station Window Replacement
- City Hall Great Hall Window Replacement.

The Engineering Department has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract documents, and City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the Police Station Window Replacement, 10-2009-016. The improvement includes the abatement of asbestos containing exterior window caulk, removal of the existing exterior aluminum framed windows, installation of new thermally broken aluminum framed windows with 1" insulating glass, aluminum framed doors with 1" insulating glass, removal, tagging and reinstallation of existing interior metal slat window blinds. Add Alternate No. 1 includes the removal of existing aluminum-framed windows and installation of new thermally broken aluminum framed windows with 1" insulating glass in a portion of the building's east elevation. All work is to be performed in accordance with the contract documents including Plan File Nos. 511-70/79 at the Police Station, 25 East 1st. Street, Des Moines, Iowa.

The estimated construction cost is \$613,600. The proposed plans, specifications, and form of contract documents are available for public inspection in the Des Moines City Engineer's Office.
