AGENDA HEADING:

Approving One-year Extension of 2009/2010 Salt Purchase Contract for 2011/2012 Snow and Ice Control Operations

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of extension of annual contract for salt to be used during the 2011-2012 snow and ice control operations. On May 18, 2009, by Roll Call No. 09-877, Council awarded the annual contract for rock salt to Hutchinson Salt Co. (Larry Bingham, President, 136 W. 12th, Baxter Springs, KS 66713) for the 2009-2010 snow and ice control season, which provided for two one-year extensions with price adjustments based on the Consumer Price Index – Urban Consumers (CPI-U) and fuel adjustment based on the Iowa Department of Transportation fuel adjustment chart. Based on the CPI-U, there is an increase of 3% over last year's salt prices. The Central Iowa Salt Group (CISG) approved the extension of the contract for the 2011-2012 snow and ice control season with the cost delivered to the Metropolitan Salt Storage Facility at \$60.36 per ton, or \$555,312 for the 9,200 tons required to fill the facility, and the cost delivered to the City of Des Moines Public Works storage facility at \$62.90 per ton, or \$81,770 for the 1,300 tons required to fill the facility. Final price adjustments, using the fuel escalator that was approved in the original contract, will be made upon ordering the salt. This may result in an estimated additional cost of up to \$4.00 per ton, for a total cost of \$679,082. Staff recommends approval of the contract extension to Hutchinson Salt Co. to provide rock salt to be used during the 2011-2012 winter season.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The City of Des Moines' Snow and Ice Control Program involves the use of salt and salt/sand mixtures throughout the winter season. The winter of 2010-11 required approximately 10,500 tons of salt to keep the City's streets in good winter driving condition.

To obtain more favorable bids, the City of Des Moines has participated in a joint bid process with the

CISG. Because of the larger quantity of salt involved, more competitive bid prices are received. This winter season, the City of Des Moines will again have the ability to have delivery and storage of the entire winter requirement for salt due to the construction of the Metropolitan Salt Storage Facility in Grimes, Iowa. Procurement will bring the City's total on-hand quantity to 14,600 tons for the 2011-2012 winter season.
