FISCAL IMPACT:


Amount: \$1,500,000 estimated acquisition and relocation, plus closing costs

<u>Funding Source</u>: 2011-2012/2016-2017 CIP, Municipal Service Center, BLD124, Page Municipal Building Improvements – 12, being TIF backed G.O. Bonds Issued and Federal Grants.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The City currently operates its field services, primarily the Department of Public Works and Park and Recreation, and other services such as Engineering Traffic and Transportation, Housing Services maintenance and satellite maintenance facilities at remote locations, in older buildings and outdated facilities. This project provides for the planning, design and development of a municipal service center. With the relocation of City facilities, there is the opportunity to create City operational efficiencies and contribute to economic development along the SE 14th Street Corridor.

A partial fee acquisition of the property located at 1610 Scott Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa, owned by Carroll Family Real Estate, LLC and other related entities, is needed for the first phase of this project. However, due to the Southeast Connector project, a total acquisition of the property will be offered. The property is occupied with an auto salvage business and relocation assistance is required.
