#### **AGENDA HEADING:**

Approving and Authorizing the execution of Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) Railway Grade Crossing Construction and Maintenance Agreements and Easement Agreement for the Southeast Connector Project

### **SYNOPSIS:**

Recommend Approval of two Grade Crossing Construction and Maintenance Agreements with BNSF Railway for proposed at-grade crossings for the Southeast Connector and SE 15<sup>th</sup> Street. The agreements address construction of crossings, installation of appropriate gates and signals, purchase of required temporary and permanent easements through a separate Easement Agreement, maintenance of crossing improvements and future replacement. Costs for construction will be based on actual expenses.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$1,521,142 (Estimated)

<u>Funding Source</u>: 2012-13 CIP, Page Street-35, Southeast Connector-S.E. Sixth Street to S.E.14<sup>th</sup> Street, STR219, \$700,000 in TIF Bonds and 2012-13 CIP, Page Street-36, Southeast Connector-S.E. 14<sup>th</sup> Street to S.E. 30<sup>th</sup> Street, STR249, \$821,142 in G.O. Bonds.

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Grade Crossing Construction and Maintenance Agreements negotiated between the City of Des Moines and BNSF Railway Company provides for construction of at-grade crossings with the Southeast Connector and S.E. 15<sup>th</sup> Street. The agreements include construction of crossings, installation of new crossing surface, installation of appropriate gates and signals, maintenance of crossing improvements and future replacement. The Southeast Connector Crossing also includes purchase of required temporary and permanent easements with a separate Easement Agreement as an Exhibit to the Construction and Maintenance Agreement. Costs for construction will be based on actual expenses.

# The costs include the following:

\$745,264	Estimated cost of SE Connector crossing construction, crossing surface, gates & signals
\$438,878	Estimated cost of S.E. 15 <sup>th</sup> Street crossing construction, crossing surface, gates & signals
\$ 52,000	Temporary and permanent easements

\$150,000 Lump sum payment for maintenance of SE Connector rail crossing, gates & signals Lump sum payment for maintenance of S.E. 15<sup>th</sup> Street rail crossing, gates & signals

These Agreements will construct the at-grade crossings included in the preferred alternative for the Southeast Connector Project. Flagging required on the rail line during roadway and railroad construction will be performed by Norfolk Southern Railway (NSR) by separate agreement. The rail is operated by NSR, and owned by BNSF. Efforts to avoid the major rail crossing by re-using a former rail embankment to serve the one rail customer were not successful. The BNSF, as the owner, determined that other business opportunities necessitated the continued operation of the existing rail line. For the purpose of the current Southeast Connector project, BNSF has also discontinued discussion regarding removal of rail west of SE 18<sup>th</sup> Street.

When negotiating new public crossings, BNSF requires closure of existing at-grade crossings. In exchange for the new Southeast Connector crossing, existing crossings to be closed are S.E. 8<sup>th</sup> and S.E. 9<sup>th</sup> Streets at the south right-of-way of Elm Street. Neither S.E. 8<sup>th</sup> Street or S.E. 9<sup>th</sup> Street currently extends north of Elm Street. Access to the few properties along Elm Street, west of S.E. 8<sup>th</sup> Street will be via S.E. 7<sup>th</sup> Street and Elm Streets. This City Council action includes closure of the two crossings. The Southeast Connector crossing agreement requires these closures to be in place before construction of the Southeast Connector at-grade crossing begins.

In exchange for the new S.E. 15<sup>th</sup> Street crossing, the Agreement provides for the existing crossing of Scott Avenue to be closed following the construction of the Southeast Connector – S.E. 15<sup>th</sup> Street to S.E. 30<sup>th</sup> Street. The future closure of Scott Avenue east of S.E. 15<sup>th</sup> Street will require local traffic, including traffic wanting to enter the eastern driveways of the City's Municipal Service Center to use the Southeast Connector or Maury Street to S.E. 18<sup>th</sup> Street. Scott Avenue is proposed for closure as part of the development of Phase 2 of the Municipal Service Center. Future private crossings needed for the Municipal Service Center will require BNSF permission.

On August 27, 2012, by Roll Call No. 12-1328, City Council approved Department of Transportation Conditional and Preliminary Term Sheet for the TIGER Discretionary Grant for the Southeast Connector Project between S.E. 14<sup>th</sup> Street and S.E. 30<sup>th</sup> Street. The Term Sheet included an interim milestone of December 2012 for the BNSF and NSR agreements. Execution of this Agreement will satisfy the established deadline for BNSF.
