AGENDA HEADING:

Approving and authorizing the execution of Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) Agreement for Indianola Avenue Widening – Phase 3 from East McKinley Avenue to East Porter Avenue.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of IDOT Agreement No. 1 12 STPU 032 for Federal Surface Transportation Program (STP) Funds for Indianola Avenue Widening – Phase 3 from East McKinley Avenue to East Porter Avenue. This project is the third phase of the Indianola Avenue Widening project which will reconstruct Indianola Avenue to increase traffic capacity, improve safety, and provide pedestrian and bicycle accommodations.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$4,400,000

Funding Source:

- \$3,000,000 Federal Surface Transportation Program Funds.
- \$1,400,000 2012-2013 CIP, Page Street-16, Indianola Avenue Widening – SE 14th to Army Post Road, STR213, G.O. Bonds.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

On October 8, 2007, by Roll Call No. 07-1994, the City Council approved the Indianola Avenue Corridor Study. On March 10, 2008, by Roll Call No. 08-435, the City Council approved the design concept for bicycle and pedestrian accommodations on the Indianola Avenue Widening – S.E. 14th Street to Army Post Road project.

Indianola Avenue from S.E. 14th Street to Army Post Road is intended to be reconstructed as a “complete street” design. A “complete street” design includes accommodations for not only vehicular traffic, but also mass transit, pedestrians, commuter and recreational bicyclists, and other recreational users. Providing facilities for all users helps reduce the number of single-occupant vehicles using the roadway, and also encourages alternative commuting options and recreational activities. The bicycle features in particular are an important part of the City’s effort to gain recognition as a bike friendly community.

The proposed project includes reconstructing and widening Indianola Avenue from East McKinley Avenue to East Porter Avenue to a 4 (four) lane boulevard with bike lanes. The project will tie into

previously completed widening projects from S.E. 14th to East McKinley Avenue, providing a 4 (four) lane section between these limits.

The Indianola Avenue Widening from East McKinley Avenue to East Porter Avenue project will begin some limited construction in 2013, but the road will not be closed until 2014. Construction of the second phase of the Indianola Avenue Widening project between S.E. 16th Court and E. McKinley Avenue was completed in 2012.
