AGENDA HEADING:

Approve procurement of de-icing chemicals for the 2013/2014 Snow and Ice Control Season.

SYNOPSIS:

The Department of Public Works has joined with five (5) other public agencies in a combined bid for deicing chemicals for the 2013-2014 snow and ice control season. In 2012 18 bid packages were mailed, and six (6) were received. In 2013 the contract was renewed with an allowable two (2) percent increase in price. Jerico Services (John Marshall, General Manager, 1506 N. 14th Street, Indianola, Iowa 50215) was the low bidder for calcium chloride, at a cost of \$0.681 per gallon delivered. In 2012-2013, the cost per gallon was \$0.668 per gallon. Staff recommends approval to purchase up to 50,000 gallons over the course of the 2013-14 winter months as needed, at \$0.681 per gallon delivered, for a total of \$34,100.

SNI Solutions (Mike Bellovics, President, 205 North Stewart Street, Geneseo, Illinois 61254) was the low bidder for Geomelt, at a cost of \$1.224 per gallon delivered. This is an increase of two (2) percent from the delivered cost of \$1.20 for the 2012-13 snow and ice control season. Staff recommends approval to purchase up to 20,000 gallons of Geomelt over the course of the winter months as necessary, at \$1.224 per gallon delivered, for a total of \$24,500.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Geomelt is a sugar beet-based agricultural product that is mixed with salt brine for anti-icing operations. Pure liquid salt brine can be used for anti-icing operations until the temperature reaches 20 degrees Fahrenheit. With the addition of Geomelt, the blended product can be applied for anti-icing until the pavement temperature reaches zero degrees Fahrenheit.

Calcium chloride is delivered pre-mixed and is used as a stand-alone product for anti-icing operations. Calcium chloride may be applied when pavement temperatures dip below zero degrees Fahrenheit.

The Department of Public Works uses these chemicals during snow and ice control operations.
