AGENDA HEADING:

Public hearing for the Fifth (2014) Year Action Plan of the 2010-2014 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Consolidated Plan.

SYNOPSIS:

This action closes the public hearing of the Fifth (2014) Year Action Plan of the 2010-2014 HUD Consolidated Plan and directs the City Manger to sign all related certifications and forward all document to the HUD Regional Office in Omaha, Nebraska.

FISCAL IMPACT:

<u>Amount</u>: \$4,077,321

Funding Source: The 2014 Program Year HUD entitlement funds available under the Consolidated Plan:

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program: \$3,040,615
- HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) Program: \$693,277
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program: \$243,429

Funding levels are contingent on final Federal action on the 2014 Federal Fiscal Year Budget.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The proposed Fifth (2014) Year Action Plan of the 2010-2014 HUD Consolidated Plan, as recommended by the Neighborhood Revitalization Board (NRB), was made available to the public for a 30 day review period. This hearing is to receive any public comments before finalizing the plan for submission to HUD. Regulations state that the plan is to be received by HUD 45 days before the start of the program year.

The 2014 Action Plan addresses the priority goals for the five (5) year strategy and one (1) year action plan. This plan includes the activities that will be funded in 2014 after Congress makes final appropriations on CDBG, HOME, and ESG. Program year 2014 is the fifth year of the current five (5) year strategy.

The five (5) year strategy addresses critical needs for affordable housing for families at or below 80 percent of HUD's median household income guidelines. Other categories of projects include economic development, infrastructure improvements, and public services that are intended to support the housing effort through homeless assistance and neighborhood revitalization.

With the uncertainty surrounding the amount of CDBG, HOME, and ESG funding the City will receive, appropriations by the City Council will be made after Congress determines the amount available. Once this occurs, the NRB will make funding recommendations to Council for their approval on appropriating the funds. This is estimated to occur in the spring of 2014.
