AGENDA HEADING:

Ordering construction of the following: SW 9th Street Widening - Titus Avenue to Kenyon Avenue - Receiving bids, (2-18-14), and Setting date of hearing, (3-10-14). Construction Estimate - \$2,270,000.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend the City Council proceed with construction of the improvement and set dates to receive bids and hold a public hearing, as required by Iowa Code, utilizing the method of financing referenced below. This project provides for widening of SW 9th Street between Titus Avenue and Kenyon Avenue to allow for a center two-way left turn lane. The project will connect into previously completed widening projects at McKinley Avenue and Porter Avenue, providing a five-lane section between these limits.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$2,270,000 (City Engineer's Estimate)

Funding Source: 2013-2014 CIP, Page Street - 39, SW 9th Street Widening - Titus Avenue to Keyon Avenue, ST246, Being:

- \$600,000 (maximum) in Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds being 90% eligible construction costs under Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) Project No. HSIP-1945(789)--8X-77; and
- \$1,048,134.67 (\$1,290,000 maximum) in Federal Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds being 80% eligible construction costs under IDOT Project No. STP-U-1945-(797)--70-77; and
- \$328,700.33 (\$500,000 maximum) in IDOT Traffic Safety Funds under IDOT Project No. CS-TSF-1945(750)--85-77 for eligible construction costs; and
- The remaining \$293,165 from Des Moines Water Works for water main construction.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Engineering Department has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract documents, and City engineer's estimate for the construction of the SW 9th Street Widening - Titus Avenue to Kenyon Avenue, 06-2011-003. The improvement includes reconstruction of SW 9th Street with 10-inch thick full-depth Portland Cement Concrete; together with pavement removal, excavation, storm drainage, subdrain, subbase placement, driveways, sidewalks, sodding, and miscellaneous associated work including cleanup; in accordance with the contract documents, including Plan File Nos. 548-068/206, on SW 9th Street - Titus Avenue to Kenyon Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa.

The estimated construction cost is \$2,270,000.00. The proposed plans, specifications, and form of contract documents are available for public inspection in the Des Moines City Engineer's Office.
