### **AGENDA HEADING:**

Approving agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey, for the operation and maintenance of five (5) stream gaging stations.

# **SYNOPSIS:**

Recommend approval of the Joint Funding Agreement for Water Resources Investigations for federal fiscal year 2014/2015 between the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) being an agency of the United States Department of the Interior, and the City of Des Moines. The Joint Funding Agreement provides for operation and maintenance of five (5) stream gaging stations within the Raccoon River and Des Moines River watersheds. The Joint Funding Agreement is provided for in a 28E agreement by Roll Call No. 11-0661, between the City of Des Moines, the City of West Des Moines, and the Des Moines Water Works.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Amount: The total cost for the period of October 1, 2014 to September 30, 2015 is \$56,760.

Funding Source: The funding distribution is as follows:

City of Des Moines \$37,340 City of West Des Moines \$11,950 Des Moines Water Works \$7,470

City of Des Moines' share is provided in the 2014-2015 Operating Budget, Flood Early Warning System Maintenance Fund, PW248425, page 235.

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Annually, the U.S. Geological Survey and the City of Des Moines execute a Joint Funding Agreement for Water Resources Investigations which provides for operation and maintenance of river and stream gaging stations which are located at 63<sup>rd</sup> Street on Walnut Creek, Easton Boulevard on Four-Mile Creek, Fleur Drive on the Raccoon River, 63<sup>rd</sup> Street on the Raccoon River, and 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue on the Des Moines River. This year, the Van Meter gage on the Raccoon River is fully federally funded and not included in this agreement. The Joint Funding Agreement for Federal Fiscal Year (FY) 2014/2015 covers the operations and maintenance for the five (5) gages for which the City of Des Moines is

obligated to pay \$56,760. The total cost to operate the stations is estimated at \$74,700 with the U.S. Geological Survey providing the remaining \$17,940 cost using National Streamgaging Information Funds.

On April 25, 2011, by Roll Call No. 11-0661, the Des Moines City Council approved a separate 28E funding agreement with the City of West Des Moines and the Des Moines Water Works to proportionally share the City of Des Moines cost for certain gauges. Based on this 28E Agreement, the City of Des Moines share of the \$56,760 will be \$37,340; the City of Des Moines will invoice the City of West Des Moines for \$11,950 and the Des Moines Water Works for \$7,470.
