AGENDA HEADING:

Ordering construction of the following: Cownie Baseball Facility Parking Lot - Receiving bids, (2-24-15), and Setting date of hearing, (3-9-15). Construction Estimate - \$1,065,000.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend the City Council proceed with construction of the improvement and set dates to receive bids and hold a public hearing, as required by Iowa Code, utilizing the method of financing referenced below. This project provides for a new parking lot with capacity for approximately 170 vehicles on the west side of the complex. A new roadway to provide access to the planned parking lot has received Revitalize Iowa's Sound Economy (RISE) grant funding from the Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT). The new parking lot and roadway will allow for additional safe, legal parking for users of the baseball complex and eliminate the current safety concerns of users of the facility, pedestrians, residents, and the traveling public caused by the present parking situation.



<u>Funding Source</u>: 2014-2015 Capital Improvement Program (CIP), Page Park - 16, Sports Complexes, PK176, Being: \$218,145 in IDOT RISE funds, being 50% eligible for roadway construction costs (\$250,000 maximum) under IDOT - RISE RM-1945(821)--9D-77; \$200,000 Polk County, \$550,000 Community Foundation of Greater Des Moines, and the remaining \$96,855 from PK176, G.O. Bonds.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Engineering Department has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract documents, and City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the Cownie Baseball Facility Parking Lot, 11-2014-001. The improvement includes construction of a new 31 foot wide City street and parking lot including clearing and grubbing, fence removal and replacement, earthwork, storm sewer and subdrain, Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) curb and gutter, Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) paving including permeable HMA paving, sidewalks, landscaping, parking lot lighting, and erosion control; all in accordance with the contract documents including Plan File Nos. 567-043/072 at the Cownie Baseball Facility, 2050 S.E. 22nd Street, Des Moines, Iowa.

The estimated construction cost is \$1,065,000. The proposed plans, specifications, and form of contract documents are available for public inspection in the Des Moines City Engineer's Office.
