AGENDA HEADING:

Resolution authorizing support of a grant application by the Polk County Housing Trust Fund (PCHTF) for funding a proposed healthy homes repair and education program in the East Bank neighborhoods.

SYNOPSIS:

The BUILD Health Challenge is a national award program designed to support community collaborations that are working to give everyone a fair chance to be healthy. The Polk County Housing Trust Fund is collaborating with local clinical care and public health agencies and Viva East Bank! on an application to the BUILD Health Challenge for an implementation grant award. If awarded, the grant will fund a program, called Healthy Homes East Bank, for home repairs and education aimed at improving homes and the health of residents in the East Bank neighborhoods. The Healthy Homes East Bank proposal has already passed the letter of interest phase for the Challenge, and has been invited to submit a full application. The City is requested to submit a letter of support for the application.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The grant is being submitted for funding of \$250,000. There will be no City funding match required. This funding will be matched by contributions from area hospitals.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The BUILD Health Challenge is a national award program designed to support community collaborations that are working to give everyone a fair chance to be healthy, and specifically to strengthen partnerships among hospitals, non-profits, local health departments and other community organizations to improve the health of low-income neighborhoods within cities with populations greater than 150,000. The BUILD Health Challenge is funded through several private foundations and invites proposals that will highlight and advance new models for improving community health and health equity. The Healthy Homes East Bank proposal has already passed the letter of interest phase for the Challenge, and has been invited to submit a full application.

The PCHTF is leading a collaboration for the BUILD Health Challenge that includes the Polk County Health Department, Mid-Iowa Health Foundation, UnityPoint, Mercy, Broadlawns, and Viva East Bank!. PCHTF will act as the fiscal agent for the grant, if awarded. Viva East Bank! is a coalition of nearly 30 community organizations working together to implement the neighborhood plans for Capitol East, Capitol Park, and Martin Luther King Jr. Park. The City approved all three (3) of the

neighborhood plans in 2014 and is also a participant in the Viva East Bank! coalition. This proposal aligns with goals outlined in the neighborhood plans and the work of Viva East Bank! to implement those plans.

For the BUILD Health Challenge, PCHTF and the other collaborators are proposing a program Healthy Homes East Bank, which aims to improve the health of residents in the East Bank neighborhoods through home repairs and education. The program is specifically targeted at improving indoor air quality, which can lead to higher risks for respiratory conditions like asthma, allergies, and COPD. Hospital data indicates East Bank households have increased rates of asthma and COPD hospitalizations compared to the county. The neighborhood plans also identified improving health and wellness and improving the existing housing stock as priority areas.

The Healthy Homes East Bank team has requested a letter in support of the grant application from the City of Des Moines. The application is due April 10, 2015 and awards will be announced in June 2015. Award recipients have two (2) years to spend the funds.
