AGENDA HEADING:

Amending Chapter 114 of the Municipal Code regarding traffic regulation changes to Snow Routes to reflect DART bus routes.

SYNOPSIS:

During snow and ice control operations, Public Works first plows hospital access routes, followed by snow routes, then to residential routes. Snow routes are planned to provide access to residents within a few blocks of their driveway. They are determined by the following criteria;

- On Federal Aid Eligible (FAE) streets identified as "Collectors" or "Arterials";
- On streets with Des Moines Area Rapid Transit (DART) routes; and
- Within approximately four (4) blocks of a residence.

These changes will update the snow routes to reflect the current DART routes and streets which are no longer identified as "Collectors".

Remove:

- 1. East 23rd Street, from Easton Boulevard to Hubbell Avenue (no longer a DART route)
- 2. East 24th Street, from Guthrie Avenue to Easton Boulevard (no longer a DART route)
- 3. 28th Street, from Grand Avenue to University Avenue (no longer a DART route)
- 4. East Aurora Avenue, from East 10th Street to E. 14th Street (no longer a DART route)

Add:

1. Woodland Avenue, from 25th Street to 31st Street (added to DART route)
