## **AGENDA HEADING:**

Set date of public hearing for conveyance of multiple City-owned properties in the Birdland project area to Home Opportunities Made Easy (HOME, Inc.).

#### **SYNOPSIS:**

This action schedules a date of public hearing for the sale of multiple City-owned vacant lots in the Birdland Area that were acquired through a voluntary, City funded buyout program following the floods of 1993 and 2008. In July, the Community Development Department released a Request for Proposal (RFP) to local developers interested in building new homes in the Birdland Area. HOME, Inc. has offered the City of Des Moines \$34,000 to purchase seven (7) lots. HOME, Inc. intends to build six (6) new single-family homes and two (2) duplexes in the Birdland Area.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Revenue of \$34,000 will go to the General Fund in accordance with City policy.

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

On July 2, 2015, the Community Development Department released an RFP to local developers interested in building new homes in the Birdland Area. In September, City staff received two (2) responses to the RFP. One (1) from Habitat for Humanity and one (1) from Home, Inc. HOME, Inc. has offered the City of Des Moines \$34,000 to purchase seven (7) lots.

The following is a list of addresses that HOME, Inc. has interest in purchasing: 203 E. Holcomb Avenue, 205 E. Holcomb Avenue, 211 E. Holcomb Avenue, 217 E. Holcomb Avenue, 219 E. Holcomb Avenue, 210 Watson Avenue, and 219 Watson Avenue.

HOME, Inc. is proposing to build a total of 10 new housing units in the Birdland Area, including six (6) new single-family homes and two (2) duplexes. Based on the proposed timeline provided in the RFP, HOME, Inc. would begin construction in 2016 and have the homes completed and sold in 2017. These homes, along with the 11 homes that Habitat for Humanity intends to build will result in a total of 21 new homes in the Birdland Area in the next two (2) years.

This development activity was initiated by the completion of the Birdland Area Redevelopment Plan.
