AGENDA HEADING:

Ordering construction of the following: Walnut Street Streetscape - Phase 1 - Receiving bids, (11-24-15), and Setting date of hearing, (12-21-15). Construction Estimate - \$4,500,000.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend the City Council proceed with construction of the improvement and set dates to receive bids and hold a public hearing, as required by Iowa Code, utilizing the method of financing referenced below. This project provides for the removal of the existing transit mall features and replace with new streetscape enhancements along Walnut Street from 5th Street to 8th Street. The project will include the addition of on street parking and will improve walkability along the Walnut Street corridor. The project was developed with input from the property owners who are financing 50% of the project costs.


Amount: \$4,500,000 City Engineer's Estimate

<u>Funding Source</u>: 2015-2016 CIP, Page Street - 49, Walnut Street Streetscape, ST252, Being: \$2,241,000 in private contributions, \$2,241,000 in Tax Increment Bonds, and the remaining \$18,000 Des Moines Water Works.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Engineering Department has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract documents, and City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the Walnut Street Streetscape - Phase 1, 04-2014-005. The improvement includes construction of sidewalks, site furnishings, plantings, Portland Cement Concrete curb and pavement, traffic signals, and Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) pavement overlay, together with the necessary removals, earthwork, clearing and grubbing, erosion control, storm sewers, traffic control; all in accordance with the contract documents, including Plan File Nos. 558-059/213 at Walnut Street from 5th Street to 8th Street, Des Moines, Iowa.

The estimated construction cost is \$4,500,000. The proposed plans, specifications, and form of contract documents are available for public inspection in the Des Moines City Engineer's Office.
