# AGENDA HEADING:

Amending the Municipal Code Section 118 relating to the volume charge for sewer services and the ERU rate to be applied to residential and nonresidential properties (Sanitary and Stormwater Utility rate increases) and eliminating a publication of notice requirement for Stormwater rate changes.

### SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of amending the Municipal Code Sections 118-149, relating to the annual increases to sanitary sewer volume charges for sewer services by 5% effective on July 1, 2016; July 1, 2017; and July 1, 2018, and recommend approval of amending the Municipal Code Sections 118-275, relating to the annual increases to the Stormwater Utility ERU rate to be applied to residential and nonresidential properties by 5% effective on July 1, 2016; July 1, 2016; July 1, 2018, and eliminate a publication of notice requirement for Stormwater rate changes.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

<u>Amount</u>: The sanitary sewer volume charge rates are proposed to increase annually by 5% beginning July 1, 2016, for three (3) years. The stormwater ERU rates are proposed to increase annually by 5% beginning July 1, 2016, for three (3) years. Proposed rates and estimated annual revenue increases follow:

<u>Funding Source</u>: Revenues will be deposited in the appropriate storm and sanitary sewer funds accounts for use on operations and capital projects per the budget plan.

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- At the December 7, 2015 Council workshop, staff presented an update on the operating and capital improvement plans for the stormwater and the sanitary sewer systems.
- Fee increases are needed in the Sanitary Sewer Fund to meet the requirements of the Long Term Control Plan addressing combined sewer overflows, increasing operating and maintenance expenses, and to continue sewer lining projects which extend the life of infrastructure.
- Fee increases are needed in the Stormwater Utility Fund to provide for required levee improvements for protection of life and property, increasing operating and maintenance expenses, and contributing to the separation of the storm and sanitary sewer system.
- Changes to Stormwater Utility Sec. 118-275 (d), (e), and (f) are proposed to eliminate language which is not consistent with the sanitary sewer Code sections and other enterprise funds. The language to be deleted was a result of a new enterprise fund being established 20 years ago, but is not necessary as all practices, policies, and accounting have always been in place for all funds. The primary change is to eliminate the requirement unique to Stormwater charges that calls for a notice of rate changes to be published in a newspaper. Even with this change Council will still receive notice during workshops and public meetings on the budget, and Stormwater rate changes will continue to be done by ordinance amendment.
