

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Engineering Department has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract documents, and City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the Four Mile Community Center Parking Lot Improvements, 11-2016-002. The improvement includes asphalt milling and a Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) overlay of the parking lot, removals, Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) curb, gutter and sidewalk, grading, installation of subdrain, bioretention cell, surface restoration, and other incidental items; all in accordance with the contract documents including Plan File Nos. 572-166/184, located at the Four Mile Community Center, 3711 Easton Boulevard, Des Moines, Iowa.

The estimated construction cost is \$170,000. The proposed plans, specifications, and form of contract documents are available for public inspection in the Des Moines City Engineer's Office.
