Ronald Walker, President, 3706 Ingersoll Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa 50312, for a total cost not to exceed \$50,800, based on a lump sum amount of \$50,300 and reimbursable costs not to exceed \$500, to provide programming, design, and construction phase services for the MacRae Park Shelter Renovation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Park and Recreation Department is seeking to improve the functionality of the existing stone veneer, heavy timber structure located in the southwest corner of MacRae Park. Constructed in the mid-1930s as a WPA project, the 1,000-square-foot shelter, is programmed to be a key component of the overall 2014 MacRae Park Conceptual Plan.

Based upon their successful design for the Greenwood Park Shelter Renovation, renamed the Jay Spence Shelter Home in 2014, Walker Coen Lorentzen Architects, Inc. was invited to meet with City Staff at the MacRae Park shelter to review the shelter's current physical condition discuss design options. The style, vintage, and proposed improvements at Greenwood Park are very similar to the shelter at MacRae Park. Staff has negotiated a Professional Services Agreement with Walker Coen Lorentzen Architects, Inc. for a total cost not to exceed \$50,800, based on a lump sum amount of \$50,300 and reimbursable costs not to exceed \$500, to provide programming, design, and construction phase services.
