#### **AGENDA HEADING:**

Approving application to the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) Fostering Advancements in Shipping and Transportation for the Long Term Achievement of National Efficiencies (FASTLANE) program for a rail port transloading facility in the City of Des Moines.

### **SYNOPSIS:**

Authorize application to the DOT for a FASTLANE Grant in an amount not to exceed \$5 million for the development of a rail port transloading facility.

The City of Des Moines is re-submitting the application in order to compete for this new 2016 funding source that was opened for a first round of applications on March 15, 2016. If awarded, this source could significantly assist with the successful development of the proposed rail port transloading facility and leverage additional resources. Applications are due by December 15, 2016.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

<u>Amount</u>: Application for an award not to exceed \$5 million with requirement for a 40% match on a minimum estimated project cost of \$8.1 million. Local match is proposed to be met in part by the \$1.7 million Rail Revolving Loan Grant Program (RRLG) loan already awarded for the proposed project and through negotiation with a preferred provider for private capital contribution.

Funding Source: DOT FASTLANE program

#### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- On October 20, 2014, by Roll Call No. 14-1668, City Council approved a series of actions related to the development of a rail port transloading facility on City-owned land in an industrially zoned area at SE 15<sup>th</sup> Street and E Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway. The site is a former long-term salvage operation location that is adjacent to an existing convergence of three (3) Class I and one (1) Class II rail lines.
- The October 2014 actions included the receipt and file of the regional Des Moines Area Rail Port Feasibility Study prepared by the Des Moines Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) which identifies City-owned land at SE 15<sup>th</sup> Street and E Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway as the preferred site for a rail port transloading facility.

- Action was also taken in October 2014 to authorize a letter of support to the Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) for a (RRLG) in the amount of \$1.7 million to be approved for development of a rail port transloading facility by a preferred provider who will be recommended by City Council. This application was approved and an agreement will be negotiated with a preferred provider when identified by City Council.
- On April 11, 2016, City Council approved submittal of an application to the FASTLANE program for the proposed Rail Port transloading facility. The application was given favorable feedback by the federal DOT in a de-briefing process, with recommendations for areas to target in a resubmittal.
