AGENDA HEADING:

Hearing on City Hall and Police Station Facade Improvements: Resolution approving plans, specifications, form of contract documents, engineer's estimate, receive and file bids, and designating lowest responsible bidder as TNT Tuckpointing and Building Restoration, L.L.C., Joshua L. Smyser, Member, \$814,131.40.

SYNOPSIS:

This is a public hearing to allow for public input on the City Hall and Police Station Facade Improvements and take the necessary actions as required by Iowa Code to authorize a contract for construction of the proposed project. City Hall (Municipal Building) and the Police Station (Municipal Court and Public Safety Building) were built in 1910 and 1918, respectively, of limestone. There appears to have been cleaning in the past but both buildings are experiencing deterioration of joints and stone. This project includes repointing of stone mortar joints, surface repair of stone, and limited stone replacement.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

On November 21, 2016, under Roll Call No. 16-1971, the City Council received and filed plans, specifications, form of contract documents, and City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the City Hall and Police Station Facade Improvements. Before the City Council can enter into a contract, it must hold a public hearing and approve the proposed plans, specifications, and form of contract documents and engineer's estimate for the construction of the City Hall and Police Station Facade Improvements, 10-2016-010. The improvement includes tuckpointing of joints and stone repair to the City Hall and to the Police Station buildings; all in accordance with the contract documents, including Plan File Nos. 563-185/189; located at 400 Robert D. Ray Drive (City Hall) and 25 E. 1st Street (Police Station), Des Moines, Iowa.



The bids were received and opened at a public meeting presided over by the City Engineer in the Shijiazhuang Room, 2nd Floor, City Administration Building, 400 E. Court Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa at 11:00 a.m. on December 20, 2016.

The City Engineer has determined that the lowest responsive, responsible bid for the construction of said improvement was submitted by TNT Tuckpointing and Building Restoration, L.L.C., Joshua L. Smyser, Member, 202 Iowa Street, Stockton, IA, 52769 in the amount of \$814,131.40, and said bid should be accepted. The Finance Director has determined that funds are available for said improvement as stated above.
