AGENDA HEADING:

Approving donation and construction agreement between Musco Sports Lighting, LLC (Musco) for Fifth Street Bridge Lighting Improvements, Jim Hansen, Secretary and General Counsel.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the proposed agreement with Musco to design, fund and construct supplemental lighting on the Fifth Street Bridge. This project complements, but is separate from, the recently completed SW 5th Street (Jackson Avenue) Bridge Rehabilitation project. Similar to the rehabilitation project, the lighting improvements project will be made possible by The Friends of Jackson Bridge, who raised private donations and pledges for funding of the project in an account at the Greater Des Moines Community Foundation.

FISCAL IMPACT:

<u>Amount</u>: \$50,000

<u>Funding Source</u>: Reduction in the private donation funding commitment for SW 5th Street (Jackson Avenue) Bridge Rehabilitation project from \$1,050,000 to \$1,000,000.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The Fifth Street (Jackson Street) Bridge is a three (3) span, pin connected Pratt truss that was originally built in 1898. The three (3) spans served as a vehicular bridge from 1898 to 1993. In 1996, the spans were closed to traffic. Following structural repairs that same year, the bridge was reopened for pedestrian use only. In 2004, some minor structural repairs were done and the wooden deck was replaced as part of a trail construction project.
- In 2013, the bridge was closed again due to severe deterioration until November 2016, when the bridge re-opened to the public following an extensive rehabilitation that restored full functionality of the multi-use trail bridge. This work included structural steel floor beam repair, lateral bracing repair, lower chord rehabilitation, end/interior diagonal rehabilitation, reconfigure and refinish wood deck with lookouts, rehabilitate handrails, blast cleaning of structural steel, painting of structural steel, modification of basic bridge lighting.
- The Fifth Street Bridge now has the opportunity to receive additional supplemental lighting, further enhancing the quality of this landmark. This work will be completely funded by the generosity of

Musco and the donor committee and includes a 10-year warranty included as Exhibit B in the donation and construction agreement.

• Per this Agreement, Musco will: pay for all design, permitting, and construction costs including costs associated with any unforeseen conditions; serve as the General Contractor managing any needed subcontractors; provide plans prepared by a licensed engineer for approval by City engineering prior to start of construction; be insured and indemnify the City per our established standards; provide the City with a 10-year warranty; and provide the City with an Operations and Maintenance Manual to enable optimum function of the supplemental bridge lighting.
