ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

City Council has directed staff to complete a corridor study of Easton Boulevard from East University Avenue to NE 56th Street (east City limits). The study will include data collection and field observation at several locations along the corridor to gain an understanding of current traffic volumes, traffic speed, crash history, and general operation of Easton Boulevard. The study will result in recommendations for any necessary improvements that could be considered in future CIP planning.

Foth Infrastructure and Environment, LLC was one of the firms selected in September 2015 to perform 2016-2017 On-Call Traffic Engineering Services for the City.

Staff has negotiated a Professional Services Agreement with Foth Infrastructure and Environment, LLC, for a total cost not to exceed \$49,900, based on hourly rates, to provide Easton Boulevard Corridor Study services.
