**AGENDA HEADING:**

One (1) year agreement between City of Des Moines and the City of Johnston for Homeland Security Services effective July 1, 2017.

**SYNOPSIS:**

The City of Johnston seeks to contract with the City of Des Moines to provide Homeland Security Services. These services were specified in the Metro Advisory Council (MAC) Homeland Security Chapter 28E Agreement filed with the Secretary of State. Rather than amend the Chapter 28E Agreement with all member parties, a separate agreement between Des Moines and Johnston is proposed with those exact services specified in the Chapter 28E agreement for the remaining term of the agreement, which ends on June 30, 2018.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- On March 7, 2016 the Des Moines City Council approved an agreement through June 30, 2018 with eight (8) member communities: Altoona, Bondurant, Carlisle, Grimes, Norwalk, Pleasant Hill, Polk City and Windsor Heights for the following Homeland Security Services:
  - Metro STAR Tactical Unit which provides a Type II Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) and Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and Explosive (CBRNE) Tactical Response Team
  - Des Moines Bomb Squad providing Type I Bomb Mitigation Response
  - Des Moines Police Identification Section assisting in the collection and preservation of evidence located in hazardous environments for contaminated crime scene processing
- At the time of that agreement, Johnston declined joining, but since has decided to join for the remainder of the contract term ending on June 30, 2018.

- Polk County is a cooperative partner in providing service and contributes full-time Sheriff's deputies to Metro STAR in lieu of payment. The Des Moines Police Departments dedicates four (4) officers to Metro STAR and four (4) officers to the Bomb Squad. Since 2007, these units have responded to nearly 500 incidences.
