AGENDA HEADING:

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval and execution of the Revision to Programmatic Agreement with the IDNR, Iowa State Historical Preservation Office, and the Iowa Office of the State Archaeologist regarding the Des Moines Sewer Separation Project, Des Moines, Polk County, Iowa required for assessment of the potential impact on natural and cultural resources is required for the Lower Oak Park and Highland Park Sewer Separation project, Near West Side Sewer Separation project, and future sewer separation projects financed by the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF).

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The following revisions have been made to the Programmatic Agreement with the IDNR, Iowa State Historical Preservation Office, and the Iowa Office of the State Archaeologist regarding the Des Moines Sewer Separation Project:

- For the Lower Oak Park and Highland Park Sewer Separation Project, the Project Location Maps were updated to reflect that the project locations in the original Phase 2 have been divided into Phase 2 and Phase 3. Also revised was a change in the location of the storm water detention basin from Guthrie Avenue & Saylor Road to 2nd Avenue and Birdland Drive. Proposed storm sewer that was to be located southeast of Union Park (Area D on the original map) has been removed from project.
- For the Near West Side Sewer Separation Project, the Project Location Map was updated to reflect project location changes between Phase 2 and Phase 3. No new project locations were added.
