AGENDA HEADING:

Public hearing on the 22nd Amendment to the Metro Center Urban Renewal Plan.

SYNOPSIS:

This roll call opens and closes the public hearing on the proposed 22nd Amendment to the Metro Center Urban Renewal Plan. The amendment updates the urban renewal plan with information as required by state law relating to the provision of tax increment financial (TIF) assistance approved by the City Council for private and public projects and an updated financial condition report.

 - Midland Building, 206 6th Avenue historic renovation and hotel conversion
