AGENDA HEADING:

Amending Chapter 114 of the Municipal Code regarding traffic regulation changes as follows:

- A. Parking Restriction—Within the cul-de-sac at the intersection of E Luster Lane and E Havens Avenue.
- B. Code Correction—Correct the termination point of East Broad Street.
- C. Parking Restriction Reversal—E 39th Court and E Madison Avenue.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the staff recommendations and the ordinance regarding the traffic regulation changes.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: Minor costs for sign installations.

<u>Funding Source</u>: 2018-19 Operating Budget, Page 84 Engineering Department Traffic and Transportation — Sign, Painting, Signal and Lighting, EG062080.


ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

A. A resident requested that parking be prohibited within the cul-de-sac at the intersection of E Luster Lane and E Havens Avenue. When vehicles are parked within the cul-de-sac it is difficult for garbage trucks and the school bus to navigate the turn due to the tight radius and center island. It is typical to restrict parking within a cul-de-sac. The proposed code changes would restrict parking within the cul-de-sac and add a corner clearance at the intersection to facilitate turning movements. The following revisions to the Municipal Code will place this change into effect.

Sec. 114-3441.05. East Luster Lane--Southeast Thirty-third Street to East Havens Avenue.

East Luster Lane, on the north side, from East Twenty-third Street to <u>and including the cul-desac at</u> East Havens Avenue, no parking any time.


East Luster Lane, on the south side, from a point 75 feet north of East Havens Avenue to East Havens Avenue, no parking any time.



B. During a field review it was discovered that the parking restriction description listed in the Municipal Code for East Broad Street had the wrong street listed. E Broad Street no longer extends to Indianola Avenue. The following revisions to the Municipal Code will place this change into effect.

Sec. 114-3033. East Broad Street--South Union Street to Southeast Tenth Street.

East Broad Street, on the south side, from Indianola Avenue Southeast Eighth Street to Southeast Eighth Court, no parking any time.



C. The Traffic and Transportation Division received a complaint about limited sight distance and speeding along E 39th Court and E Madison Avenue. Staff reviewed this area and found that the on street parking in the current configuration could limit visibility of oncoming vehicles due to the curvature of the road. To improve the sight distance and create some traffic calming effect, staff recommends that two (2) sections of no parking be moved to the other side of the street. The following revisions to the Municipal Code are necessary to place this change into effect.

Sec. 114-2909. East Thirty-ninth Court--Mattern Avenue to East Madison Avenue Fortieth Street.

East Thirty-ninth Court, on the west side, from East Ovid Avenue to East Madison Seneca Avenue, no parking any time.


East Thirty-ninth Court, on the east side, from East Seneca Avenue to East Fortieth Street, no parking any time.

Sec. 114-3451. East Madison Avenue--First Street to dead end east of East Forty-second Street.

East Madison Avenue, on the north side, from East Fortieth Street to a point 50 feet east of East Forty-second Street Briarcliff Drive, no parking any time.

East Madison Avenue, on the south side, from Briarcliff Drive to East Forty-first Street, no parking any time.

<u>East Madison Avenue</u>, on the north side, from East Forty-first Street to a point 50 feet east of East Forty-second Street, no parking any time.
