### AGENDA HEADING:

Approving donation to Polk Soil & Water Conservation District for the cooperative purchase of a deep core aerator.

#### SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the donation to Polk Soil & Water Conservation District for the cooperative purchase of a deep core aerator for use in the construction of stormwater Best Management Practices (BMPs) that are subsidized by the City's stormwater utility.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

<u>Amount</u>: \$15,000

<u>Funding Source</u>: 2019-20 Operating Budget - Stormwater Utility Management E301 PW248423, page 229

# **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- The City's stormwater utility rebates back 50% of the cost of soil quality restoration through the stormwater BMP rebate program; 100% of the cost is rebated in priority watersheds. It is one of the most effective and promising methods available to practically every property owner in the City.
- Resident experience with area landscape contractors, though, has shown that the necessary equipment is not readily available on the rental market. The market for this service is not yet big enough yet to justify the investment by private enterprises. The City's subsidy of the purchase of this piece of specialized equipment is intended to help lower barriers and make this BMP more easily obtained by residents using a landscaping contractor of their choice.
- Polk Soil & Water Conservation District serves as the lead agency administering the City's stormwater BMP rebate program in the Easter Lake watershed. They perform work on the City's behalf for the promotion of the rebate program and runs a rental program for specialty farm equipment.

• City staff have approved the make and model of the machine to be purchased and reviewed and approved the rental agreement the Polk Soil & Water Conservation District will use to rent the machine to landscape contractors or property owners.
