AGENDA HEADING:

Amending Chapter 114 of the Municipal Code regarding traffic regulation changes as follows:

- A. Removal of on-street Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) parking space—Capitol Avenue near E. 21st Street.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the staff recommendation and the ordinance regarding the traffic regulation changes.

Amount: Minor costs for sign removals.

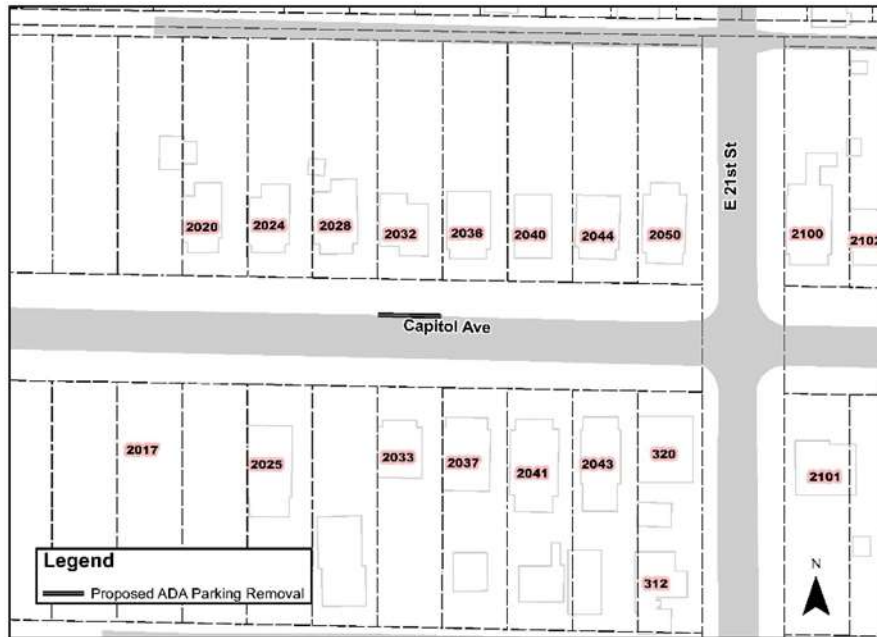

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- A. Residents may request on-street ADA parking spaces be signed on residential streets where on-street parking is allowed if they provide doctor certification that on-street parking is needed based on their condition. The ADA space on the north side of Capitol Avenue was signed based on a request from the resident at 2032 Capitol Avenue in 2000. This resident no longer lives at this location and the ADA space is no longer needed. The proposed code change will remove the ADA on-street parking space at this location. The following revisions to the Municipal Code will place these changes into effect.

Sec. 114-3045. Capitol Avenue--East Twelfth Street to East Twenty-second Street.

~~Capitol Avenue, on the north side, from a point 175 feet west of East Twenty first Street to a point 30 feet west thereof, is designated a handicapped parking space and is subject to the same prohibition as is found in section 114-616(a) of this Code.~~
