AGENDA HEADING:

Ordering construction of the following: Des Moines Fire Station No. 11 - Receiving bids, (12-3-19), and Setting date of hearing, (12-16-19). Construction Estimate - \$4,900,000.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend the City Council proceed with construction of the improvement and set dates to receive bids and hold a public hearing, as required by Iowa Code, utilizing the method of financing referenced below. The new fire station will be approximately 14,600 square feet and includes three (3) drive-through apparatus bays, sleeping quarters, locker rooms, kitchen, TV/training room, other building support spaces, parking, and E. 42nd Street improvements. The facility will be designed and submitted for LEED certification with geothermal and solar array as the infrastructure.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- Fire Station No. 11 will serve the northeast part of the City and will provide residents in the area with more efficient and responsive emergency services.
- The Engineering Department has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract documents, and City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the Des Moines Fire Station No. 11, 10-2019-001. The improvement includes new construction of an approximately 14,600 square feet fire station which includes a 2-story mechanical area, living quarters, and a three (3) bay apparatus area; design consists of cast stone, brick masonry, glazed aluminum curtainwall and architectural aluminum metal panels; wall structure consists of perimeter bearing walls and internal bearing and non-bearing concrete masonry units; floor structure is steel beam framing and concrete/metal floor decking; roof structure is metal roof joists and decking; roofing system is a single-ply, fully adhered membrane on low slope roof areas and metal roof for the apparatus bay; also sidewalks, utilities and reconstruction of E. 42nd Street; all work in accordance with the contract documents, including Plan File Nos. 601-070/210, located at 4150 E. 42nd Street.

- This building incorporates a number of renewable and green features. These features include a geothermal mechanical HVAC system, solar array for electricity, rain water collection for landscaping, a ventilation system to filter exhaust fumes from administration areas, and the separation of contaminated equipment and clean equipment areas.
- The City razed a former hotel building that previously occupied the site via a demolition contract. The address of the hotel was 4144 Hubbell Avenue, as it faced Hubbell Avenue. The new fire station will face E. 42nd Street.
- The estimated construction cost is \$4,900,000. The proposed plans, specifications, and form of contract documents are available for public inspection in the Des Moines City Engineer's Office.
- Construction is anticipated to begin in the first quarter of 2020 and be complete by mid-late summer of 2021.
- City Council, on June 24, 2019, by Roll Call No. 19-1043, approved the City of Des Moines Post Bid General Contractor Quality Assurance Questionnaire Policy in recognition that a governmental entity may obtain information from the lowest responsible bidder to determine bidder's responsibility relating to the bidder's experience, number of employees, and ability to finance the cost of the public improvement; and that Vertical Infrastructure Projects are designed for human occupancy and construction of such projects can be complex and difficult, requiring submission of the General Quality Assurance Questionnaire to the apparent lowest bidder on Vertical Infrastructure Projects as defined in the Policy.
- Des Moines Fire Station No. 11 Project is subject to City of Des Moines Post Bid General Contractor Quality Assurance Questionnaire Policy approved on June 24, 2019, by Roll Call No. 19-1043, consistent with the recognitions made by the City Council in that Roll Call and consistent with the policy.
