NFC provides unique lending programs and related services to facilitate targeted neighborhood revitalization in Polk **County and Cedar** Rapids, Iowa through partnerships with residents, governments, community-based organizations, financial institutions and the business community.

Why Neighborhood Finance Corp?

- NFC was formed as a part of a larger initiative in 1990 to improve Des Moines neighborhoods
- Five neighborhoods were chosen and each neighborhood had a smaller "target area" where resources were to be focused
- The original neighborhoods in 1991 were
 Beaverdale, Capitol East, Columbus Park,
 River Bend/North Park and Woodland Heights
- Each neighborhood developed a neighborhood plan
- For 29 years NFC has worked with the City to develop a lending map using this process

Neighborhood Reinvest Down Payment Program

- \$10,500 0% interest deferred loan (APR 0%)
- Used for down payment for NFC borrowers

- NFC has provided loans to over 6,000 households
- Loans have totaled over \$350 million
- In 2019, NFC lending generated over \$88 million in investments
- Financial Institutions participate in offerings and equity investments over \$140 million to date.

Government Source Funds

NFC receives \$1 million a year from the City of Des Moines, Polk County & the City of Cedar Rapids, and \$200,000 from West Des Moines. As an organization we pride ourselves on being good stewards of the government source (28E funds). Since 1991, NFC has recycled over 50% of the funds received.

Funds are used for:

- Up to \$10,000 for renovations as a 5-year forgivable loan
- Up to \$20,000 for renovations if down-sizing to a single-family property as a 10 year forgivable loan
- Up to \$2,500 in closing costs for low and moderate income home buyers
- As a loss reserves on our lending pools
- 28E funds are not used to support NFC operations

NFC is a **NeighborWorks America** Organization

- ✓ Received \$339,500 of organizational and capital funding in 2019
- Used NeighborWorks funding to start Neighborhood Reinvest Down Payment program
- Take neighborhood groups to the Community Leadership Institute once a year (Friends of SW 9th, Highland/Oak Park, 6th Avenue Corridor)
- Received a grant to cover the origination & servicing costs of the 6 Flood loans with the City of Des Moines

NFC may be the largest **non-profit renovation lender** in the country with the ability to sell loans to Fannie Mae – contract to sell \$20 million a year

NFC is a Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI)

- Access funding from the US Treasury source of funds for our 2% interest
 2nd mortgages & Front Porch Exterior Loan Program.
- ✓ Since 2015 have received \$5 million

NFC Properties renovates or builds 10-15 homes a year in our lending areas
