# **AGENDA HEADING:**

First consideration to amend Chapters 26 and 46 of the Municipal Code to adopt the 2018 editions of the International Building Code; International Residential Code; International Existing Building Code; International Fire Code; and the State of Iowa Energy Code.

### **SYNOPSIS:**

Approval of this action amends Chapter 26 and Chapter 46 of the Municipal Code by amending and adopting the most recent published editions of the following codes:

- o 2018 International Fire Code (IFC)
- o 2018 International Building Code (IBC)
- o 2018 International Residential Code (IRC)
- o 2018 International Existing Building Code (IEBC)
- State Energy Code

FISCAL IMPACT: NONE

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The second and third reading is requested to be waived to meet adoption timeframes identified in Iowa laws for the adoption of referenced standards.
- The City of Des Moines Building & Fire Board of Appeals has reviewed and recommends adoption of the codes and amendments listed in this section.
- Adoption of these codes follows the recommendation of the Central Iowa Code Consortium.
- Adopting these codes and amendments supports the City's goals for sustainable governance and reducing energy consumption through a unified code adoption process.

# The following summarizes amendments to Chapter 26:

- o Adopts the State Energy Code
- Adopts the 2018 editions of the IRC, IBC, and IEBC. Amendments included in this article are consistent with those proposed by the Central Iowa Code Consortium. Notable amendments include the following:
  - Fire sprinkler thresholds for new buildings
  - Retroactive fire sprinkler provisions for fire-damaged apartment buildings
  - ➤ Provisions that require storm shelters in new schools and emergency operations facilities, such as fire stations, 911 centers, etc. Storm shelters are also required for school additions

# The following summarizes amendments to Chapter 46:

- Chapter 46 is the City Fire Code. The fire code, like the other codes, went through the Central Iowa Code Consortium (CICC) process. CICC recommendations have been incorporated into Chapter 46 with the most notable changes being the following:
  - > Fire sprinkler thresholds for new buildings
  - > Sprinkler design standards NFPA 13 only for sprinklered buildings
  - Fire access roads for single-family developments and outdoor venues
