AGENDA HEADING:

Approval to purchase five (5) portable digital imaging equipment for the statewide Explosive Ordnance Detection (EOD) teams from Scanna MSC Inc. 2910 Hyde Park Street, Sarasota, FL 34239.

SYNOPSIS:

The Police Department recommends the purchase of ruggedized portable x-ray equipment with flexible yet sensitive imaging plates. The equipment is designed for quick deployment and access to confined areas. The imaging plates are thin and vary in size for flexibility to wrap around objects. The scanner operates from a secured wireless connection to send real time images to an integrated tablet. This allows the explosive technician to see the inner workings of a container or suspicious package from a safe distance and determine the best possible plan for mitigation. This equipment is available per the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) contract 47QSWA18D0062.

Amount: \$132,239.55

<u>Funding Source</u>: The 2020 Homeland Security Explosive Ordnance Device Grant on page 211 of the FY2020 Adopted Operating Budget, Special Revenues and Other Funds

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The portable digital imaging equipment has been presented to and approved by the Homeland Security Oversight committee and Steering committee for purchase using the awarded grant funding. The City of Des Moines serves as the financial manager for the grant funds with the understanding that the use of the funds must support all the certified statewide Explosive Ordnance Detection (EOD) teams. The purchase of these portable imaging equipment will replace aged equipment for five (5) of the statewide teams.
- The ruggedized digital imaging equipment is designed for quick deployment. The Imaging plates are thin, vary in size and are flexible making them ideal for access to confined spaces. The flexible material can be wrapped around an object for clear imaging. The plates can be cleared and reused multiple times. The battery powered scanner sends a high-resolution image wirelessly over a secured network to a designated tablet for clear viewing from a safe distance. The image can be stored in the tablet and later added to the case file.
