AGENDA HEADING:

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the Agreement between the City of Des Moines and WRA for the Meredith Trail Bank Repair near S.W. 7th Street public improvement project.

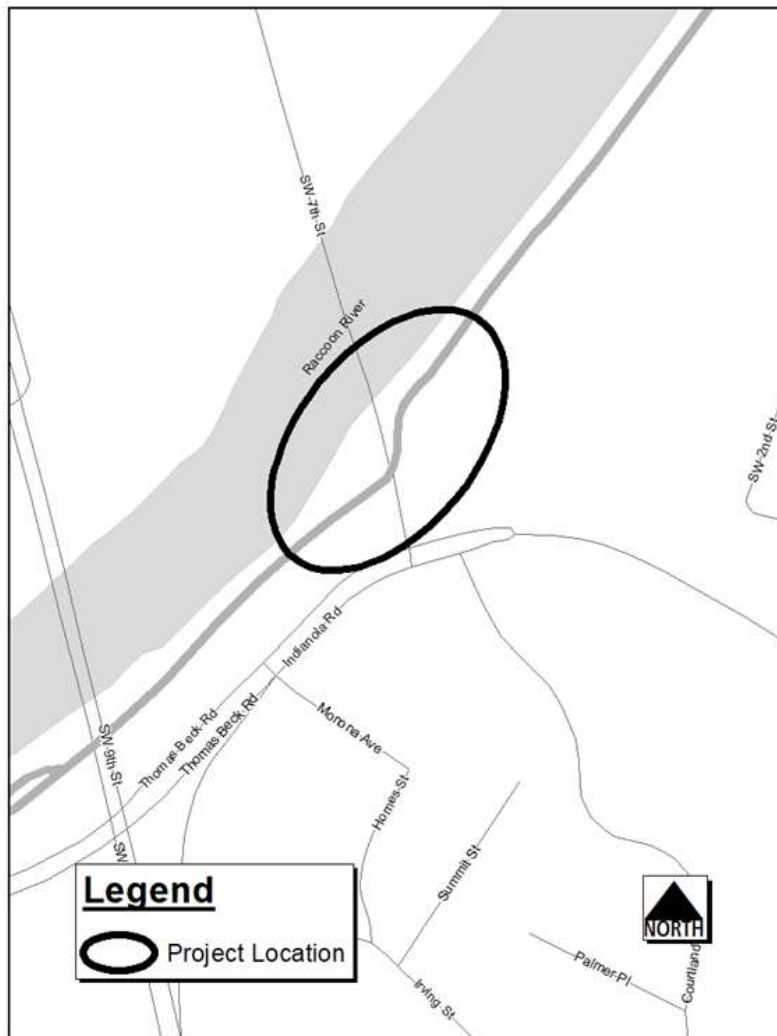
FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$642,744.10

Funding Source: 2021-2022 CIP, Page 64, Multi-Use Trails, PK045, Being: \$519,117.30 in G.O. Bonds and \$123,626.80 from the WRA.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The City of Des Moines plans to complete a public improvement project that consists of repairing and stabilizing a section of the south bank of the Raccoon River along the Meredith Trail that was damaged from erosion. The repair is located on the south bank of the Raccoon river just west of the S.W. 7th Street Bridge.
- This project will include additional bank stabilization improvements necessary to protect WRA facilities that are adjacent to the Meredith Trail, but not necessary for the trail repair. The City and WRA agree that it is of mutual benefit to coordinate the bank stabilization improvements needed to protect WRA's facilities along with the construction of the trail repair.
- The WRA agrees to reimburse the City for all design and construction costs associated with the bank stabilization needed to protect WRA's facilities. The City and WRA have entered into this Agreement for the purpose of establishing the terms and conditions by which the City will design and construct the improvements.
