AGENDA HEADING:

Amending Chapter 114 of the Municipal Code regarding parking in residential districts increasing the fine for unlawful over-weight and semi-trailer/tractor parking from \$15 to \$100.

SYNOPSIS:

At the September 13, 2021, City Council meeting, Council directed the City Manager and Legal Department to recommend an appropriate fine for violations of Sec. 114-632 related to unlawful parking of oversized/overweight vehicles on public streets in residential districts. The current fine amount of \$15 was believed to be too low. Recommend approval of the staff recommendation increasing the fine amount under Sec. 114-632 to \$100.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: Potential increased revenue based on increased enforcement and higher fine amounts.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

In addition to the recommended ordinance amendment, police personnel addressed internal
enforcement approaches including clarifying ordinance requirements and how to handle calls
for unlawfully parked semi-tractors on roads in residential districts. The recommended \$100
fine amount is the same fine amount for operating a truck in violation of the truck route law.
This change essentially recommends providing equal fine amounts for driving and parking
overweight/oversized vehicles unlawfully on public residential streets.
