AGENDA HEADING:

Request acceptance of an increase in funding through the COPS Anti-Heroin grant program issued by the Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy. The grant is designated to reimburse law enforcement overtime associated with mid to high level heroin investigations.

SYNOPSIS:

The City of Des Moines Police Department requests approval to accept a \$7,000 increase in the amount of grant funding provided by the Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy. The total grant award will increase to \$14,700 without a matching fund requirement while the performance period remains as July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022. The funds must be directed to support law enforcement investigation of heroin related cases.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$7,700 with an additional \$7,000

Funding Source: The Adopted Operating Budget for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2022
Page 199 Special Revenues.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The grant was originally accepted during October 4, 2021, City Council meeting. The grant funds, awarded by the Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy, are dedicated to the reimbursement of officer overtime spent on heroin related cases. The initial award of \$7,700 was expended by the end of November 2021. The Office of Drug Control Policy offered additional funds resulting in the amount of the grant award being increase to \$14,700. The additional \$7,000 must be used for the same purpose and prior to June 30, 2022.
