AGENDA HEADING:

Amendment to Chapter 114 regarding parking trailers on City streets.

SYNOPSIS:

The City has been receiving complaints of trailers being left unattended and not attached to a vehicle on streets. This code amendment would clarify that as an offence that could be issued a parking ticket in the amount of \$100.

FISCAL IMPACT: NONE

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The prohibition for parking a vehicle having a freight capacity greater than one (1) ton would remain a violation in residentially zoned neighborhoods.
- The code would prohibit parking a trailer, semitrailer, road tractor or truck tractor unit unattended and unattached to a vehicle at any time on any street. It would allow parking a trailer on a street when at an active construction site between the hours of 7:00 am and 10:00 p.m.
- The ticket amount of \$100 remains unchanged.
- The ordinance will clarify what situations allow for ticketing of illegally stored trailers on City streets.
- Tickets can be issued by neighborhood inspection division of neighborhood services.

Motion Carried.
