AGENDA HEADING:

Reprogramming of prior years' unspent Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, to be included in the 2024 Annual Action Plan as part of the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

SYNOPSIS:

Each year, there are programs or activities that are unable to fully expend their CDBG allocations. As such, those unexpended funds are then reallocated to other programs or services so that the CDBG funding can continue to be utilized under eligible activities.

• Reprogrammed CDBG funds will be allocated to the following programs or activities:

- The reallocation of homeowner rehabilitation under Improving Our Neighborhoods (ION) is more of a tracking exercise rather than a true reallocation to ensure City staff communicate the correct housing activities, closed out projects, and homeowner demographics to HUD each calendar year.
- The 2023 Public Services reallocation of \$345,000 (CDB0623) may be withdrawn if a subrecipient cannot produce audit information before June 30, 2024. If the subrecipient produces the requested information by this date, the 2023 Public Services funding of \$345,000 will remain earmarked for that use, and the Real Estate Acquisition by Nonprofit Housing Developers will be reduced by \$345,000.
- Housing Development Site Preparation was intended to be used for major redevelopment of a three (3)-acre infill site where the City was acquiring by execution of a demolition lien. Funds were reserved to offset the development costs of producing affordable housing units. The project, however, was cancelled because the property owner repaid the lien amount to the City.
- Any development agreements that are a result of any of this funding will be subject to certain design standards. Currently, the Development Services Department is working on an agreement attachment outlining design requirements, such as siding materials, associated with any City incentives or grant funding.
