AGENDA HEADING:

Hold public hearing on proposed issuance of Series 2024A Bonds and Taxable Series 2024B for essential corporate (ECP), urban renewal (UR), general corporate (GCP) purposes for the fiscal year (FY) 2025 Capital Improvement budget and adopting additional action on the authorization and issuance of said bonds.

SYNOPSIS:

Hold public hearings and direct notices regarding the issuance of Not to Exceed (NTE) \$64.5M for the approved Capital Improvement Plan on April 15, 2024.

As part of this issuance, \$5M of urban renewal bonds and \$1M of general obligation bonds for the parking garage at 1200 Mulbury St. will be issued. Council provided authority for this at the August 7, 2023 meeting thus is not included in the hearings but will be reflected in the overall issuance.

The bonds are used to fund the Capital Improvement plan approved by Council on April 15, 2024

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: Anticipated total issuance is \$57,645,000 for the Series 2024A and \$10,185,000 for the Series 2024B Taxable Issuance.

Funding Source: FY 2024-FY 2028 Capital Improvement Plan

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

State law prohibits General Corporate Purpose (GCP) issuances over \$1,300,000 which thus requires separate hearings on each item. Finance staff works with bond counsel to group projects together to reduce the overall number of hearings. Essential corporate purposes (ECP) issuances do not have a cap.

ECP – NTE \$34M GO Bonds

The acquisition, construction, reconstruction, enlargement, improvement, and repair of bridges, culverts, retaining walls, viaducts, underpasses, grade crossing separations, and approaches thereto; rehabilitation and improvement of parks already owned, including the removal, replacement and planting of trees in the parks, and facilities, equipment, and improvements commonly found in city

parks; equipping of fire, sanitation, and street departments; acquisition and improvement of real estate for cemeteries, and the construction, reconstruction, and repair of cemetery facilities; acquisition, construction, reconstruction, and improvement of all waterways, and real and personal property, useful for the protection or reclamation of property situated within the corporate limits of cities from floods or high waters, and for the protection of property in cities from the effects of flood waters, including the deepening, widening, alteration, change, diversion, or other improvement of watercourses, within or without the city limits, the construction of levees, embankments, structures, impounding reservoirs, or conduits, and the establishment, improvement, and widening of streets, avenues, boulevards, and alleys across and adjacent to the project, as well as the development and beautification of the banks and other areas adjacent to flood control improvements; opening, widening, extending, grading, and draining of the right-of-way of streets, highways, avenues, alleys, public grounds, and market places, and the removal and replacement of dead or diseased trees thereon; construction, reconstruction, and repairing of any street improvements; acquisition, construction, reconstruction, improvement, repair, and equipping of waterworks, water mains, and extensions, and real and personal property, useful for providing potable water to residents of a city; acquisition, installation, and repair of traffic control devices; acquisition, construction, improvement, and installation of street lighting fixtures, connections, and facilities; construction, reconstruction, and repair of sidewalks and pedestrian underpasses and overpasses; and the acquisition of real estate needed for any of the foregoing purposes; acquisition, restoration, or demolition of abandoned, dilapidated, or dangerous buildings, structures or properties or the abatement of a nuisance; and the establishment and funding of programs to provide for or assist in providing for the acquisition, restoration or demolition of housing, as part of a municipal housing project.
