AGENDA HEADING:

Approving and authorizing the execution of a Cooperative Agreement between the Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the City of Des Moines for construction and maintenance of the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 project.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of IDOT Agreement No. 2025-16-025 which specifies responsibilities between the City and IDOT for construction and maintenance of new trail paving and associated site work constructed within the I-235 right-of-way as part of the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 project from West River Drive to 2nd Avenue along the Des Moines River.



<u>Funding Source</u>: Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025 Capital Improvement Program (CIP), Page 80, Central Place Levee Trail, PK193, Being: \$500,000 (maximum) Federal Recreations Trails (FRT) Program, \$500,000 (maximum) Federal Transportation Alternatives (TAP) Funds, \$250,000, General Funds made possible by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding, and the remaining \$550,000 in G.O. Bonds transferred from PK045 Multi-Use Trails

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

• Phase 1 of the Central Place Levee Trail includes the construction of a new multi-use trail section between Lauridsen Skatepark, located just southeast of 2nd Avenue and School Street, and the intersection of Franklin Avenue and 2nd Avenue in north-central Des Moines. Much of the trail alignment is atop the Central Place Levee offering views of the Des Moines River Greenway. The new trail will be a 10-foot-wide Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) paved section, approximately 1.5-miles in length, and will include additional access spurs at University Avenue and College Avenue. The last remaining segment of West River Drive will be removed as part of this project and an emergency access off Illinois Street will be constructed as an alternative ingress/egress route for the parking lot, trail, and Lauridsen Skatepark.

- Phase 1 of the Central Place Levee Trail project has a combined total of grant funding in the amount of \$1,000,000. On January 9, 2023, by Roll Call No. 23-011, the City Council approved the IDOT Agreement No. 23-TAP-112 providing \$500,000 in TAP funds to the City for the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 project. On February 19, 2024, by Roll Call No. 24-0231, City Council approved an addendum to IDOT agreement No. 23-TAP-112-A for \$500,000 in FRT Program funds for the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 Project.
- A portion of the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 Project includes construction under the Interstate 235 Bridge over Des Moines River, including trail construction and modification to the bridge drainage system above the new trial. This work requires the Cooperative Agreement between IDOT and the City to allow construction of the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 project in the IDOT right-of-way and assigning maintenance responsibilities to the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 project improvements.
- IDOT Agreement No. 2025-16-025 specifies responsibilities for the City and IDOT for project costs, permits, design, construction, maintenance, and traffic control during construction. At the completion of the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 project, the City will be responsible for maintaining the new trail, and the bridge deck drain constructed with the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 project.
- Construction of the Central Place Levee Trail Phase 1 project is anticipated to begin in the spring 2025 and be completed in the fall 2025.
- The City of Des Moines multi-use trail counters logged an estimated 3.2 million trail uses in 2023 across the system. It is anticipated that this number will increase year-by-year as the system continues to grow and gaps such as the one being filled by this project are completed.
