AGENDA HEADING:

Approval of 2025 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) subrecipient funding under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

SYNOPSIS:

The City of Des Moines has been allocated \$328,836 in ESG funding from the HUD for program year 2025. This City Council action confirms the 2025 ESG subrecipient recommendations as presented by the Homeward grant committee, the Homeward Board, and City staff.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The ESG program is designed to assist people to swiftly regain stability in permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis and/or homelessness. Eligible categories of assistance:
 - o Street Outreach,
 - o Emergency Shelters (including transitional housing),
 - o Homelessness Prevention Assistance,
 - o Rapid Re-housing Assistance,
 - o Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) for data collection, and
 - o Administration.
- The ESG request for proposals was available on July 29, 2025, and the Homeward grant committee and City staff reviewed the proposals on September 2, 2025. The Homeward Board met on September 8, 2025, to approve subrecipient recommendations, which is being forwarded to the City Council.
