## **AGENDA HEADING:**

Approval of Home Investment Partnership Program funding, as authorized under the American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP), from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to Anawim Housing for Nonprofit Operating Assistance.

#### **SYNOPSIS:**

Anawim Housing will use HOME-ARP funding to support nonprofit operating assistance associated with the organization's efforts to serve individuals and families experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$175,000

<u>Funding Source</u>: HOME Investment Partnerships Program funding, as authorized under the American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP), from HUD

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- HOME-ARP is a one (1)-time HUD funding source allocated to participating jurisdictions, such as the City of Des Moines, who also receive a HOME Program annual allocation. HOME-ARP closely follows the model of the existing HOME program, with slight differences in program administration due to the targeted populations and activities.
- On December 9, 2024, City Council approved a substantial amendment to the City of Des Moines HOME-ARP Allocation Plan to allow the City to quickly expend the funding for supportive services, nonprofit operations, or capacity building.
- Under the HOME-ARP Program, funds used for nonprofit operating assistance must support the
  organization's general operating costs. Eligible operating costs include the day-to-day expenses
  necessary to maintain the nonprofit's administrative functions, such as staff salaries for
  organizational management, rent, utilities, insurance, and office expenses.

• Anawim Housing also used HOME-ARP funds for the rehabilitation of 4845 Merle Hay Road, the former site of a Days Inn Hotel. The project contains 40 units, of which five (5) units will be designated as City-funded HOME-ARP units.
