DMPD Intoxicated Driver Prevention Program Section 163 Grant Application October 1, 2008 through September 30, 2009

Last year Des Moines Police officers made 774 OWI arrests and a total of 1,262 alcohol related arrests. This is a decrease from 2006 where there were 801 OWI arrests but total contacts increased by 139 from 1,123. The Section 163/410 Contract has proved to be invaluable in the enforcement of alcohol related offenses and providing the citizens of Des Moines a safe city in which to travel.

In conjunction with alcohol awareness programs at college campuses located within the City of Des Moines, officers will provide educational presentations focusing on impaired driving.

Another important component of the Section 163 Grant is the opportunity to purchase PBT(s). The PBT(s) are also a necessary piece of equipment in the enforcement of alcohol related offenses.

Staffing Plan:

- a. Officers to conduct 1,800 hours of directed overtime enforcement.
- b. Officers to provide 24 hours of alcohol educational presentations to grade school and high school students on an overtime basis.
- c. Officers to provide 90 hours for alcohol awareness educational programs at college campuses on an overtime basis.

Contract Activities:

- a. Conduct traffic enforcement directed at alcohol/drug-related, occupant protection, speed, stop sign/stop light and other moving violation activity including two (2) multiagency enforcement activities.
- b. Conduct at least 12 public information and educational activities.

Objective/Performance Measures:

- a. Enforcement, including two multi-agency activities, conducted with at least 100 alcohol/drug-related contacts and 1,400 occupant protection and moving violation contacts.
- b. 12 educational and public information activities conducted and reported.
- c. One alcohol awareness seminar at each of the three college campuses located within the city limits.
