LEGISLATIVE UPDATE March 12, 2007

The Legislature's first funnel is Friday, March 9th which means all policy bills must pass a committee in the House or Senate by then to remain viable. Bills assigned to the Ways & Means, Appropriations or Government Oversight Committees and bills initiated by the Governor are exempt for the funnel deadline.

Several bills of interest being reviewed by City staff, include:

HOUSE FILES

Bill:

HF 465 MOTORCYCLE HELMETS

Sponsor:

Ford

Description:

Requires a minor to wear an approved helmet when driving or riding on

a motorcycle. Makes violations punishable by a \$25 fine of both driver

and passenger. (Transportation)

Bill:

HF 466 FRANCHISE TAX (Successor to HF200)

Subcommittee: Local Government

Description:

Re-enacts the \$8.8 million appropriation from the state franchise to cities and counties that was repealed in 2003. Floor Manager: Thomas

Bill:

HF 483 INTERFERENCE WITH OFFICIAL ACTS

Sponsor:

Jacoby

Description:

Requires that interference with official acts include bodily or serious injury to a peace officer, EMS provider, correctional officer or other member of a protected class, rather than just an attempt. Makes it an aggravated misdemeanor if the injury is a bodily injury to a peace officer or EMS worker, or a class "D" felony if the injury is to a correctional officer, and if a serious injury, a class "D" or a class "C"

felony respectively.

Description:

Authorizes recall elections for city council members. Requires the recall petition to have at least 20 % of the total votes cast in the last

city council election, and at least 50. (Local Government)

Sponsor: Ford

Description: Authorizes a city or county that has approved a 7% hotel and motel tax

to impose an additional 2% tax without another election. Requires the revenues be used to comply with the lowa Targeted Small Business

Procurement Act. (Ways & Means)

Bill: HF 549 DUMPING PHONE NUMBER

Sponsor: Arnold

Description: Requires the DNR to have a twenty-four hour, toll-free phone number

for people to make reports on suspected illegal dumping. Requires the

DNR to offer rewards of up to \$100. (Environmental Protection)

Bill: HF 552 SEX OFFENDER ZONES

Sponsor: Schickel

Description: Makes it an aggravated misdemeanor for registered sex offender who

has been convicted of certain offense against minors to be on the grounds of a school, public park, child care facility, or swimming pool unless the offender is there to transport the offender's child, attend a parent teacher conference, to vote, or at the park, library or pool with the offender's child. Requires the offender to have written permission

to be on the premises of any of these areas. (Public Safety)

Bill: HF 553 OPEN HIRING MEETINGS

Description: Prohibits a governmental entity, including schools and government

subdivisions, from entering into a contract to hire a consultant to help hire personnel until the entity has held a public hearing. Requires the governmental entity to give notice of the hearing and to not make a decision on the contract until after the hearing is conducted. (State

Bill: HF 558 NEIGHBORHOOD DISTRICTS (Successor to HF 171)

Description: Allows a city to create a district comprised of an area zoned, in whole

or part, for residential use known as a neighborhood. Allows the ordinance creating the district to make the residential property subject to the property tax. Exempts homes occupied by persons who claim for the low-income elderly and disabled property tax credit. Allows the notices of meetings, to establish or amend a district, to each affected
