Dear Mr. Hansen:

In response to your written appeal, the City of Des Moines convened an Administrative Hearing on March 30, 2009, at 9:30 a.m. regarding a motor vehicle impound (Impound Tag Number 280843). Pursuant to Section 114-485.16 of the Municipal Code, you were given an opportunity to be heard at that time.

The issue before the Hearing Officer was the removal and impoundment of an illegally parked vehicle. Section 114-485.11 of the Municipal Code states, "...[that] the police department...may remove and impound vehicles or cause vehicles to be removed and impounded when the vehicles are stopped or parked in violation of this chapter or other city ordinances and, in so doing, may employ such means as are reasonably necessary.

Meter Checker Kim Robinson stated that she saw a vehicle parked on the south side of Ingersoll Avenue in the 3600 block at approximately 7:30 a.m. Ms. Robinson said the vehicle was parked along the curb in a "Curb Lane Buses Only 6:00 – 8:30 a.m. Mon – Fri." zone. Ms. Robinson said she issued a citation and impounded the vehicle.

Joseph Hansen attended the Hearing and said he understood receiving a ticket, but there was no sign stating it was a tow away zone, so his vehicle should not have been impounded. Mr. Hansen said he had received a ticket for the same violation a few months ago and his car was not impounded at that time.

I find probable cause was proven for impounding the vehicle. You have the right to appeal the ruling to the City Council by filing an appeal with the City Clerk's Office within seven (7) days of receipt of the ruling. Your appeal must include the reason upon which you are basing your appeal. You are also



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

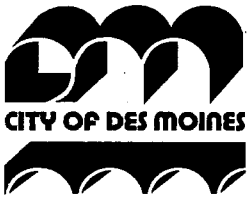

City v. Hansen
Vehicle Impound

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Mr. Hansen, is it okay if we start your hearing a little early?

JOSEPH HANSEN: Yes.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Good morning. My name is LeAnn Ducey and I am an Administrative Hearing Officer. It is 9:23 a.m. on March 30, 2009 and we are conducting an administrative hearing on a vehicle impound. The appellant is Joseph Hansen. When I call you to give testimony today, please come up to the podium, speak into the microphone and state your full name and address for the record. You will then be sworn in. This is an informal hearing and to that matter the hearing is now open. Would the representative from the City please come forward, identify yourself and present any information you have pertaining to this hearing.

KIM ROBINSON: Kim Robinson, City of Des Moines.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Please raise your right hand. Do you Kim Robinson, swear or affirm the testimony you are about to give is the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?

KIM ROBINSON: Yes ma'am.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Go ahead.

KIM ROBINSON: Uhm, I impounded this vehicle. Uhm, it was parked on the south side of Ingersoll Avenue at 7:30. The signs clearly state curb lane is only for buses only, no parking at that time issued above. I issued the citation and impounded the vehicle.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay. Thank you.

KIM ROBINSON: Thanks.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Mr. Hansen. Please state your name and address.

JOSEPH HANSEN: I'm Joseph Hansen, 3401 Kingman Blvd., Des Moines.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Please raise your right hand. Do you Joseph Hansen, swear or affirm the testimony you are about to give is the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?

JOSEPH HANSEN: Yes ma'am.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay. Tell me why you're here today.

JOSEPH HANSEN: I'm here today because, uhm, I got the ticket and my car towed and I can understand getting a ticket for being parked there, uh, but nowhere on the signs anywhere does it say anything about it being a tow away zone. Uhm, and I just thought that the towing was sort of a ridiculous measure to take. Uhm, Ingersoll is not that busy of a street. Uhm, the a, none of the signs that say bus route or no parking anywhere on those signs that say tow away zone. I've seen plenty of signs around the City that say, ya know, 24-hour loading zone, tow away or on the meters downtown where, ya know, traffic really does need to get through. On the busier streets downtown the meters will say tow away zone from 7 to 9. Uhm, and there was nothing on anywhere that said tow away. I've actually gotten one parking ticket there a few months ago and the car wasn't towed so I was just surprised to find out that it was towed that morning. And, and Ms. Robinson even noted in the, uhm, in the police report that she saw my wallet in the car which made it, ya know, a lot bigger hassle because I had to go down to the City. When I called the City to find out if the car had been towed or stolen or what and they said yeah we have it in the impound. All you need to do is bring \$20 and a photo ID. So I went down there with the \$20 and, ya know, my car key to prove that it was me because I didn't have my photo ID obviously because it was towed in the car. So then they had me fill out this paperwork so I could go to Owen Crist and then come back from Owen Crist to the Police Department to get the release for the vehicle, go back to Owen Crist to get my vehicle and then I found out there was gonna be like some kind of a \$90 impound charge on top of the, ya know, \$30 ticket, on top of the \$20. I mean, it ended up being \$150 parking ticket and, ya know, 2-1/2 hours worth of hassle. An inconvenience not only for me but, ya know, the person that had to drive me around to do that so.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Well, there is a sign that says curb lane, buses only, 6:00 to 8:30 a.m., Monday through Friday.

JOSEPH HANSEN: Right, but it doesn't say anything that it's a tow away zone.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: And there is a lot of, uhm, it's my understanding that you cannot park on any city street for longer than 24 hours at a time. So,

JOSEPH HANSEN: It was only parked there...

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay, but let me finish. So if you think that there needed to be a sign there that said towing, they'd have to put on every single street in the City of Des Moines.

JOSEPH HANSEN: Why do they put it some places but not others?

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: I don't know, but as you stated, I think in your, your notes, you said that you were told it was up to the discretion of the officer.

JOSEPH HANSEN: That's, that's after the fact. You know what I mean.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: What's after the fact? Is that, at the discretion of the person who....

JOSEPH HANSEN: I found out...

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: I'm speaking right now. It is up to the discretion of the person who gives you the ticket whether to have you impounded or not. That can't, that wouldn't be after the fact that would be right during the time.

JOSEPH HANSEN: No. I was told after the fact that it was up to the discretion of the officer. I had no idea.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Well, how would they tell you ahead of time?

JOSEPH HANSEN: I don't know, maybe, I don't know.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Okay. All right. Do you have anything else to present today?

JOSEPH HANSEN: No just, uh, I just want to reiterate that I don't understand why some places that, you know, where it does make sense that, you know, vehicles are towed because of the importance of the flow of traffic like downtown in the meters that say, you know, 7 to 9 tow away or, uhm, ya know, the loading zones that need to be kept open and they say tow away or, you know, private property tow away. Uhm, you know, those seem to make sense. You know, the car wasn't parked there 24 hours. It was actually probably parked there about 8 hours, you know, so it's not, uhm.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Well, the buses need to be able to get in and out to pick up passengers so I believe that's why it was done. Anyway, uhm, unless you have anything else to present, I am ruling in the favor of the City and you will be responsible for paying the tickets, or ticket or tickets and, uhm, you will not be reimbursed.

JOSEPH HANSEN: Okay.

HEARING OFFICER LEANN DUCEY: Thank you. Oh, also, should you disagree you can, uhm, send in an appeal. I'll send you a written notice to this fact and appeal to the City Council. Thank you.

Hi Kathy,

This is Joe Hansen, I spoke with you yesterday regarding the ticket(s) I received for parking on the 3700 block of Ingersoll on Thurs. 2-26-2009 at 7:31 am and the subsequent towing and impound of my car for no apparent good reason. I have attached two pictures of the parking signs on the street there and neither one has any mention of that being a tow away zone. I believe a \$30 ticket would be punishment enough, but the tow was completely unreasonable and uncalled for. Especially when I couldn't get an answer from the police dept. in the morning or the tow company as to why it was towed. Then, when I called in to find out the reason at about 4:00pm that afternoon, they said it was because it was in a bus zone. When I asked why it was towed if there was no mention of that area being a tow away zone, they told me that it was up to the officer's discretion and in the police report it was noted that the officer noticed my wallet was in the car, which added to my inconvenience because I had to make 2 trips to the police station and tow company. It was at this time I found out that I received a ticket that was not left with my car in addition to the impound and inconvenience for both myself and my girlfriend who had to run me all over town while very ill, which is the reason I was parked there in the first place. I stopped by the previous evening to drop off soup, gatorade, crackers, medicine, and 7-up to her because she was so ill and planned on going home, but she was feeling so awful that she asked me to stay with her in case she needed a ride to the doctor or emergency room and I forgot I had parked on the street instead of the parking lot like I normally do. I asked to have both the ticket and police report mailed to me and I only received the ticket with no police report. Upon talking with you, you told me that I actually received two tickets which is totally uncalled for in my opinion. The reason it has taken more than the ten days to file my appeal is that I have been out of town taking care of, spending time with and watching my father pass away in my home town in Wisconsin. I left for WI The Friday after I got the ticket and came back on Sunday evening, March 8th after we admitted him to the hospital and then a nursing home. I received a call from my brother saying that he took a turn for the worse and left again Tuesday Morning the 10th, he died Friday the 13th, we had his wake the evening of the 16th and the funeral the 17th and I returned to Des Moines late Wed. evening the 18th. Hopefully that is a good enough reason for your office to consider still granting me a hearing to contest and seek a refund for the towing and impound fees. If your vehicle and the personal property contained within, or parked in violation of a City ordinance, you have a right, under administrative hearing to determine whether there was probable cause. To exercise this right, you must file a City of Des Moines Release Form with the City Clerk's office, at east first and locust street, with the City of Des Moines. Should you request an administrative hearing, you may request a bond in an amount sufficient to cover all charges attributable to the towing and storage of the vehicle.

If, at the hearing, the hearing officer determines there was no probable cause, the bond shall be refunded upon presentation to the City of Des Moines. Probable Cause and the bond receipt.

Should you not request a hearing, you may claim your motor vehicle from the towing contractor upon payment of all charges attributable to the impoundment of the vehicle.

This is only a release, which entitles you to claim your vehicle and any personal property contained within from the Towing Contractor. The vehicle and any personal property contained within is not considered claimed until all towing and storage fees are paid to the Towing Contractor.
