AGENDA HEADING:

Amending Chapter 2, Division 5, regarding the Youth Advisory Board, to allow persons under the age of 23 to participate as youth members of the board.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the amended ordinance which allows persons under the age of 23 to participate as youth members of the board. Previously, the ordinance provided for persons under the age of 19 to act as youth members of the board. This ordinance change would extend that age limit to include persons of college age to participate as youth members.

FISCAL IMPACT: NONE

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

This amendment allows for persons under the age of 23 to participate as youth members of the board. This change has been discussed as an option to aid in youth member turn-over and to assist in recruiting a strong leadership of older individuals to help guide the board in reaching their goals and successfully implementing their annual action plans.

The four at-large representative seats may be filled by persons under the age of 23, whether or not affiliated with a college or university, but that have residency in the City of Des Moines. The four representatives from community organizations may be filled by persons under the age of 23 affiliated with a college or university within the City of Des Moines.

This amendment also lengthens the term for youth members with no less than 15 months and no more than 111 months. The current ordinance states that they can serve no more than 51 months.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Municipal Code of the City of Des Moines, Iowa, 2000, adopted by Ordinance No. 13,827, passed June 5, 2000, and amended by Ordinance No. 14,232 passed May 5, 2003, and by Ordinance No. 14,243 passed June 23, 2003, and by Ordinance No. 14,466 passed July 18, 2005, by amending Section 2-1176, relating to composition of the Youth Advisory Board.

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Des Moines, Iowa:

Section 1. That the Municipal Code of the City of Des Moines, Iowa, 2000, adopted by Ordinance No. 13,827, passed June 5, 2000, and amended by Ordinance No. 14,232 passed May 5, 2003, and by Ordinance No. 14,243 passed June 23, 2003, and by Ordinance No. 14,466 passed July 18, 2005, is hereby amended by amending Section 2-1176, relating to composition of the Youth Advisory Board, as follows:

Sec. 2-1176. Created; composition; appointment.

- (a) There is established in and for the city a youth advisory board comprised of 2223 members.
- (b) The youth advisory board shall consist of seven adult members and sixteen fifteen youth members.
 - (1) The adult members <u>must be 23 years of age or over and</u> shall include representatives from the following originating organizations:
 - a. One representative from the YMCA.
 - b. One representative from the Des Moines Independent Community School District.
 - c. One representative from the Greater Des Moines Partnership.
 - d. Two representatives to be appointed by the city manager. Employees of the city of Des Moines may serve in this capacity.
 - e. representatives nominated by community organizations such as: Iowa Homeless Youth Emergency Youth Services, Professionals Organizations, Rotary Club, Drake University, Des Moines University, Des Moines Public Library, the YMCA, the Des Independent Community School District, the Greater Des Moines Partnership, the city manager's office, or others.

The youth members must be under the age of 2319 at the (2) time of appointment and shall include:

of appointment and shall include:

One representative from each of the following 42originating organizations:

- East High School
- Hoover High School
- Lincoln High School
- North High School
- Roosevelt High School
- Scavo Campus School
- Dowling High School
- Des Moines Christian School
- Four representatives at-large b.
- representatives nominated by community c. Four organizations (Creative Visions, Making Connections, Grubb YMCA, Des Moines Public Library, Sister City Commission, Partners for Economic Progress, and others) or college or university students
- All adult members shall be appointed for thirty-six month terms commencing the first meeting in June. All youth members shall be appointed for terms commencing the first day in June and ending the first meeting in August upon high school graduation, for members appointed to represent high schools, and until reaching the age of twenty three years for all other members. The length of term for a youth member shall be no less than 15 months and no more than 51111 months.
- Notwithstanding the appointment and residency requirements of division 1 of this chapter, the board shall appoint all members by election, subject to removal by the city council at any time. Residency for the youth of the youth advisory board will be as follows: the youth must attend a Des Moines high school or college or university full time, live within the city limits of Des Moines, or have fulfilled one of these requirements at the time of their appointment to the board.
- Upon termination or resignation of any board member, that (e) member shall be replaced by an individual from the departing members originating organization. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 2-1048, the new member shall serve a term pursuant to section 2-1176(c).
- No person holding elective office in the municipal government shall be eligible for appointment to or service on the board.
- This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
