# AGENDA HEADING:

Amending Chapter 10 of the Municipal Code Regarding Required Separation of Temporary Non-profit Establishments Selling Liquor, Wine, or Beer.

#### SYNOPSIS:

Approval of first reading of the ordinance with various changes to temporary 5-day liquor control licenses conditions and regulations.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: Minor increase in revenue as additional temporary liquor licenses are issued.

Funding Source: FY 2007-08 Operating Budget, p. 76, GE001, CCL010000, Administration, Other, 490030.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

On June 4, 2007, by Roll Call 07-1094, Council directed staff to review and make recommendations regarding amendments to paragraph (13) of Section 10-43 regarding the required separation between a temporary non-profit establishment selling liquor, wine or beer, and schools. Staff recommends the following changes, which eliminate the separation requirement outside the regular school hours of any school within 150 feet:

## Sec. 10-43. Conditions for approval.

The following conditions and regulations must be met by an applicant for a liquor control license or a wine or beer permit:

(13) The required separation from any church, <u>school</u>, public park or licensed child care center imposed by subsection (6)a of this section, and the requirements of subsection (7)a of this section, shall not apply to nonprofit corporations which make application for a five-day liquor control license, where the sale of alcoholic beverages occurs only between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., <u>and outside the regular school hours of any school within 150 feet</u>.

beverages occurs only between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., and outside the regular school hours of any school within 150 feet.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
