#### **NBSD ACTIVITIES BY WARD**

WARD 1: CARPENTER CHAUTAUQUA PARK, DRAKE, DRAKE PARK, KING IRVING, KIRKWOOD GLEN, MONDAMIN PRESIDENTIAL, AND RIVER BEND NEIGHBORHOODS

- Several meetings were held with new and seasoned landlords in the Kirkwood Glen, Carpenter, Drake and Drake Park neighborhoods to provide information and suggestions on how to combat problem tenants
- Graffiti was on the increase this summer as well as drug activity that centered around 22<sup>nd</sup> and University
- The Chautauqua Park neighborhood continued to be quiet with a low incidence of reported crime.
- Representatives of the King-Irving Neighborhood attended the Neighbors USA Conference in Baton Rouge, LA where they were awarded 2<sup>nd</sup> Place in the Physical Revitalization Category for their tree planting project
- Mondamin-Presidential and King-Irving neighborhoods are actively working with the Thrivent Builds Neighborhood Coalition, a project that will provide major revitalization in these neighborhoods
- Graffiti, illegal dumping and junk and debris complaints were very low in the River Bend neighborhood, however, criminal activity in the 1700-1800 block of 8<sup>th</sup> Street was a major concern for the neighborhood and the police department committed a task force to combat the problem.
- WARD 2: ACCENT, CAPITOL EAST, CAPITOL PARK, FAIRGROUNDS, GRAY'S WOODS, HIGHLAND PARK, LAUREL HILL, M.L. KING, JR., OAK PARK, UNION PARK AND VALLEY HIGH MANOR NEIGHBORHOODS
  - Excessive speeding south of University to Dean Ave. was a concern this summer for the ACCENT Neighborhood. The Traffic Unit set up radar in this area as well as in several areas in Gray's Woods and Valley High Manor neighborhoods.

- Graffiti was a dominating factor in Capitol Park, Capitol East and M.L. King, Jr. neighborhoods over the summer. Illegal dumping and junk and debris on the parking were also issue in these neighborhoods
- The major concern in the Highland Park, Oak Park and Union Park neighborhoods was the criminal activity associated with several bars in the neighborhoods

#### **INSPECTIONS SUMMARY**

Graffiti very low, illegal dumps very low, routine housing inspections. Noticeable repeat complaints on junk and debris from a select few people on the River Bend Board on the same properties over and over specifically on their own block or "walking area". No matter how small a violation may be and in several cases no violation. This is also true for broken windows, no screens and occasionally a hole in the roof. Junk and debris complaints from River Bend Association Members have been very low in the past year. Noticeable difference at the River Bend meetings is it has turned over to almost a whole new group of neighbors in the past six months.

#### POLICE SUMMARY

The main concerns for Riverbend during the second quarter of 2007 revolved around criminal activity in the 1700-1800 block of 8th. The neighborhood has seen a drastic increase in drug and gang issues along with several shootings and one homicide. The focus on the 8<sup>th</sup> street problems was at 1712 8<sup>th</sup>, 1720 8<sup>th</sup>, 1724 8<sup>th</sup>, and 1812 8<sup>th</sup>. 1712 8<sup>th</sup> is owned by Matt Doris. There was a tremendous number of police calls at this address. Large groups of people gathering on this property, drug dealing and use, as well as junk and debris complaints. Mr. Doris was extremely uncooperative. Zoning was involved in several notices for the junk complaints and the police department committed a task force to combat the problems. Several arrests were made until a fire at 1712 8th forced Mr. Doris to vacate the property. 1720 is a vacant public nuisance house. To deal with the loitering on this property a pole light was placed in the alley to the rear of the property. Progress was made, after several meetings, to save the property and establish a plan to rehabilitate it. Steve Feldman is the owner of 1724 8th. He was cooperative in working with the police to solve the problems at his property. 1812 8<sup>th</sup> was a gang house where the owner was attempting to evict. I worked with the association and the owner to establish enough evidence for the landlord to rid himself of the problem tenant. He is now working to repair the damage and clean the property to sell or re-rent.

Additional areas of concern are 1317 8<sup>th</sup> and the 1500 block of 9<sup>th</sup>. 1317 8<sup>th</sup> is another drug/gang type complaint. The owner is uncooperative is solving the problem. The police department is working on this complaint currently. 1500 block of 8<sup>th</sup> involves Larry Elliott and his illegal business he is running out of his residence. Bryan Davis is investigating this complaint and working toward a solution.

Complaints of these types of activities seemed to decreased. The alley that proceeds north of Hull Ave. Tavern was recently purchased from the city by neighborhood residents. During bar close, patrons from the bar, continued to drive up the alley causing damage to homeowners' properties. A cement barricade was recently placed at the entrance to the alley preventing vehicular traffic. This stopped damage to homeowners' property.

The second quarter in the Downtown saw a pick-up of activity with the warmer weather starting. The homeless shelter and camps were still an issue. Norfolk Southern Railroad decided the homeless could not camp on their property and had to be moved on. The heavy rains and flooding delayed the move out until middle June. The Court Ave District picked up activity bringing complaints of loud music and trash left after parties. These complaints were handled by talking with the business owners and coordinating efforts with Operation Downtown. The month of June started with several special events bringing thousands of visitors and tourist into the area. The only complaint from businesses and residents was on the street closures during the triathlon and the way the closures were promoted. There was a shooting incident which occurred during the start of the Arts Festival in which injuries were held to a minimum due to fast professional Police action. The school resource officers begin bike patrol during the month of June along with the PUSH UNIT in the evening hours. Both have been praised by the residents and businesses. A new market opened on Court Ave along with apartments filling up above Spaghetti Market and at the Kirkwood Hotel.

#### INSPECTOR SUMMARY

The downtown areas continue to have occasional homeless problems. They have been moved off all railroad properties. We are dealing with junk in the alleys and sporadic cases of graffiti. The downtown housing stock remains in good condition, however the older buildings continue to need constant maintenance.

The annual SCRUB was a large success, and although it was a partnership with two other neighborhoods, NOG provided the vast majority of volunteers. The business community experiences many of the same problems as other areas of town, but to a much lesser degree. The Ingersoll Area Association is taking a pro-active approach and working hard to insure the security of its members and patrons. With the assistance of the NARC Office, we are attempting to put together a safety presentation for business owners. Compliance with parking regulations has somewhat improved. Part of this is probably due to better weather; however, there seems to be fewer junked cars on the streets. Criminal mischief and graffiti have declined over the quarter and other criminal activity has been minimal. In checking the Department's Daily Reports, major crime is almost non-existent. I still monitor activities along 33<sup>rd</sup> Street and keep in contact with neighbors, but things have quieted down, and with the exception of some conflict with one or two owners of rental properties, things seem normal. Any problems now seem to be cosmetic.

Neighborhood Inspections and I continue to work with landlords in the area, offering assistance, and stressing the need for them and their tenants to be good neighbors. This seems to be working, as we receive several calls each month from different landlords with a variety of questions or information about suspicious activities around their properties.

I was assisted by the Narcotics Unit in a consent search of the property where a small amount of drugs were located and the tenant was arrested. Two other drug complaints in the neighborhood were also cleared. We continue to work with landlords in the area, offering assistance, and stressing the need for them and their tenants to be good neighbors. This seems to be working, as I receive several calls each month from different landlords with a variety of questions or information about suspicious activities around their properties

#### INSPECTOR SUMMARY

The Sherman Hill are continues to see much restoration and renovation throughout the area. We have a couple of apartment buildings that continue to give the police and our division some problems. We are focusing our efforts to resolving these issues. We have three current public nuisance properties that will be completely renovated this year.
